Session Description

Mainstreaming water into Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs), National Adaptation Plans (NAPs), and global climate processes enhances climate change adaptation and mitigation measures. - Serve as a platform to connect water and climate experts and to support countries in integrating and subsequently implementing water-related measures in NDCs and NAPs as one of the priorities of the UN System-wide Strategy on Water and Sanitation;
- Contribute to the Baku Dialogue on Water for Climate Action by providing an opportunity for countries that have already endorsed the COP29 Declaration on Water for Climate Action to exchange experiences and to encourage other countries to endorse the declaration and to join the initiative.
