The 1.5°C challenge: Promises and Pitfalls of Technofix Climate Politics

The Paris Agreement gives hope to many people who are especially vulnerable to climate change. In a decision that may prove key for our futures, governments agreed to 'to pursue efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels'. But many experts ask whether and how this goal may be achieved. Actions from NDC contributions will only drive the world towards 3°C of global warming.

In the face of this lack of action, support is emerging for untested and risky new technologies. Action Aid International, Heinrich-Böll-Foundation and Misereor invite you to discuss the 'technofixes' that are currently discussed and explore pathways to ambitious mitigation and sustainable adaptation pathways especially for vulnerable people.
