- mitigation, adaptation, finance, capacity building and technology transfer or support

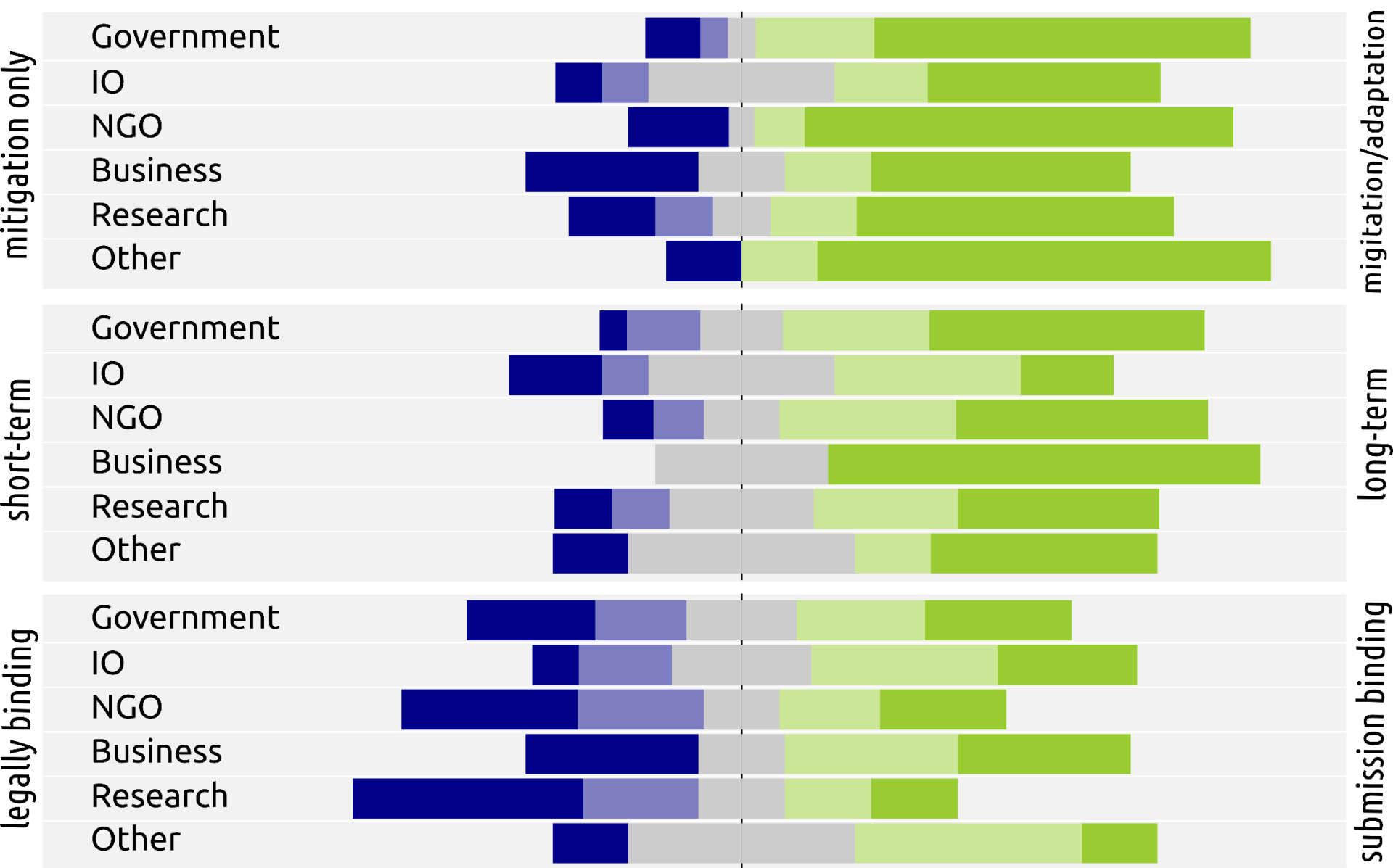
## Time horizon

- Long term goals

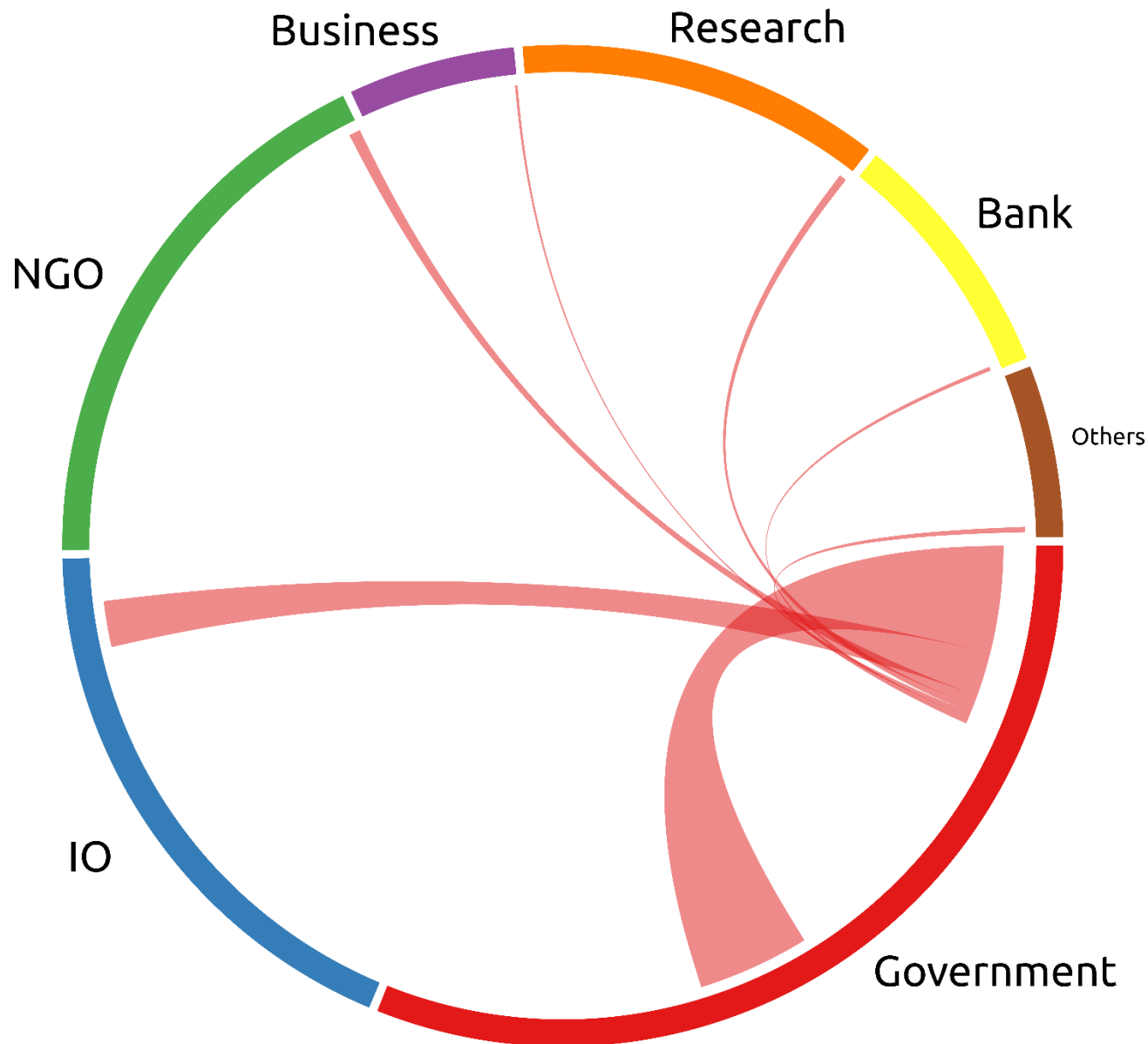
## Legal form

- INDCs should be legally binding and anchored in PA
- Submission of INDCs an obligation, INDCs themselves not

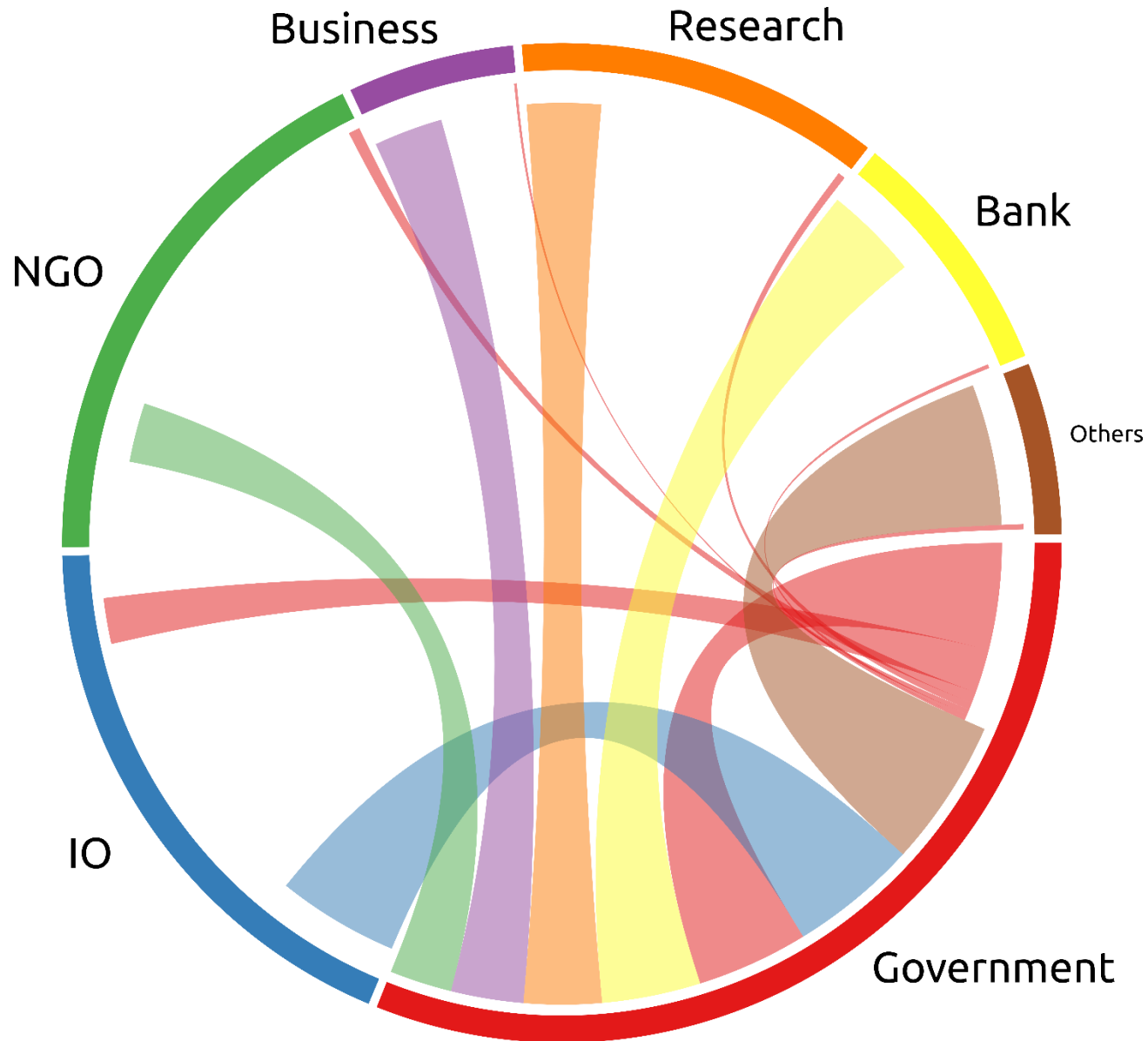
# Preferences among stakeholders on INDCs pre-Paris



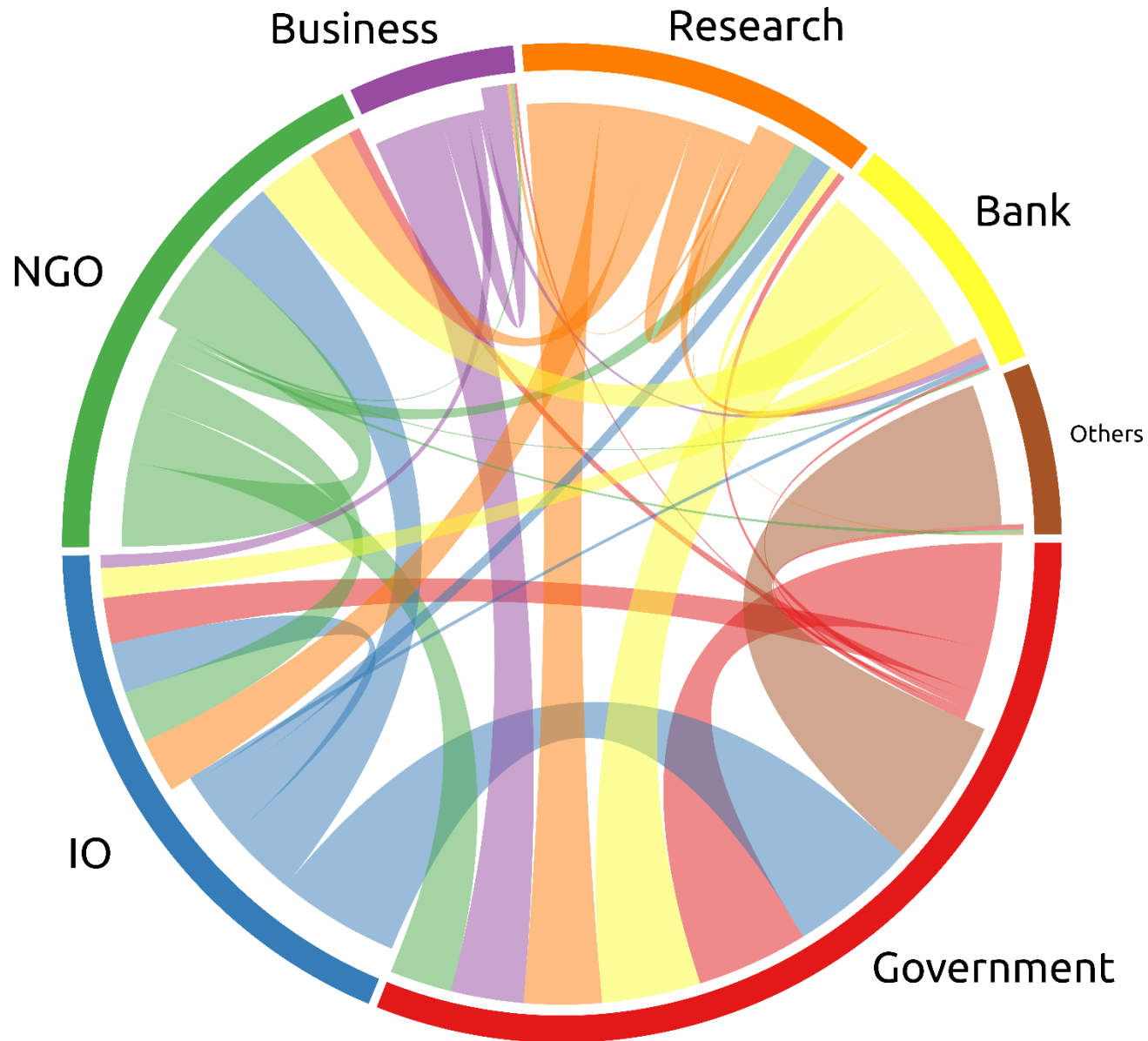

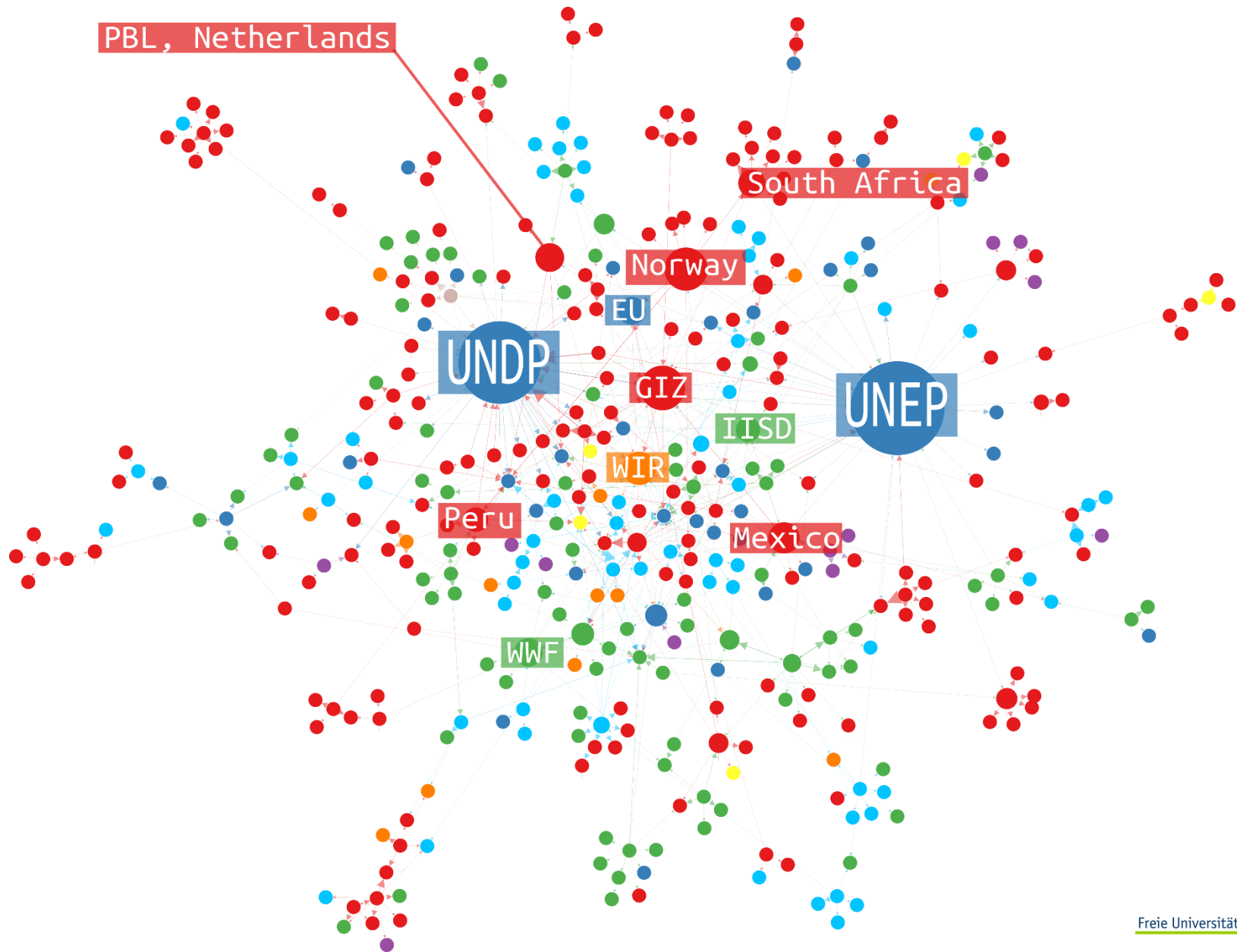

# Preliminary findings

- While similar actors tend to cooperate amongst each other, cross-cutting actions also exist
  - Increasing role of non-party stakeholders reflected in networks
  - Some actors can act as brokers to connect parties and stakeholders
