NDC accounting frameworks for non-Annex 1 Parties- Experiences from Colombia, Costa Rica, and Mexico

Since 2014 Colombia, Costa Rica, and Mexico cooperate on the elaboration of national accounting systems to monitor the GHG emission reductions, under the project **Accounting Rules for the Achievement of the Mitigation Goals of Non-Annex I Countries**. Accounting systems are meant to transparently and robustly trace the achievement of national mitigation targets, expressed in the National Determined Contribution (NDC) by each country.

With the intention to avoid duplication of efforts, as well as to efficiently and effectively build up such systems, the involved countries evaluate –at the national level– existing experiences gained in various M-R-V activities as well as on the elaboration of GHG inventories. The results will help to promote accounting systems elsewhere and feed back into the discussions around the transparency framework under the Convention.

The event will bring together key experts, researchers and government officials, who will discuss some key issues for constructing national accounting systems and discuss with participants.
