FLEGT: why and what?

- Forest Law Enforcement, Governance and Trade
- International concern over illegal logging and its impacts:
 - rule of law / cost / environment / conflict
- EU response (2003): FLEGT action plan
- **supply-** and **demand-side** measures to combat illegal logging and associated trade.

The EU FLEGT Action Plan

- proposes Voluntary Partnership Agreements (VPAs)
 - Technical trade agreements to tackle illegal logging
- Supply-side (wood-producing countries)
 - governance improvement in forest sector
 - measures to regulate and control timber trade
- Demand-side (EU)
 - Green public procurement policies
 - Private sector & investment initiatives
 - Illegal timber regulation

FLEGT Partnership Agreements

Some key elements:

- Voluntary but legally binding
- Made to measure: content defined during negotiations
- Multi-stakeholder participatory process

For a final result:

- legal licensing system for timber exports to EU
 - 1. Partner country ⇒ 2. delivers a FLEGT license ⇒
 - 3. to accompany timber shipments ⇒ 4. controlled upon arrival in EU

Why embracing VPA?

Long and complex process: what are thus the advantages for engaging?

For the country

- Increased revenue collection
- Improved legal and policy framework
- Clear roles & responsibilities & less corruption Improve the country's image

For the stakeholders incl. communities

- Transparent and inclusive system
- Clearer rights and responsibilities


For the private sector

- Better market access, larger market share, new niches
- Credibility + clarity + reliability: promote investment
