The PECC integrates actions, policies and programs with a long-term sustainable development vision, emanating from the National Development Plan 2007-2012 and sets aspirational goals with a long-term vision.

The PECC structure integrates four chapters: **Mitigation, Adaptation, Cross-Cutting Policy** and a **Long-Term View**. Of the 294 total goals there are:

- ✓ 86 goals related to mitigation
 - ✓ 142 adaptation targets
- \checkmark 66 goals that consider mainstreaming issues

Reporting process for progress on PECC goals

For the implementation of the PECC, measuring and reporting instruments have been created:

- ✓ The online platform SIAT-PECC.
- ✓ Progress and achievement indicators for goals.
- ✓ A specific working group of the Interministerial Commission on Climate Change (CICC) for the monitoring of the program – the PECC Working Group
- ✓ A Methodological Annex that, based on the SIAT-PECC system, presents the formals, calculations and assumptions for each of the goals.

This is complemented by an **Independent Evaluation** with the objective to **verify the level of confidence** of the data reported on mitigation and adaptation, and obtain recommendations to improve the reliability of the information. This evaluation was carried out by internationally recognized firms, DNV and IMCO, with support from the GIZ.

Mexico committed at the COP 15 (Cancun) to reduce **30% of emissions by 2020** compared to the baseline scenario. We expect to **mitigate 82 MtCO2e/year** on top of that proposed in the prospective to 2020.

Progress on Adaptation by key system

Adaptation: measures and adjustments in natural or human systems, in response to climatic stimuli, actual or expected or their effects, that can moderate harm or exploit their beneficial aspects



The average global progress of the 141 adaptation goals was 65% by April 2012. 34 goals reached 100% in the first two months of 2012. To the end of August it was 77%.

Cross-cutting policy elements

The **mainstreaming of climate change public policy** refers to items, issues, objectives, and goals or programs **involving two or more units of the Federal Public Administration** (APF). In the 2009-2012 PECC, there are 19 participating responsible entities.



The **average** percentage of completion by cross-cutting policy element is **52%.** What's more, at the end of April 2012, 25 of the 66 goals (38% of the total goals) were completed.

POSITIVE EFFECTS OF THE PECC

- 1. The **gathering of key actors in development in the country**, contributing to identify actions to address the cross-cutting aspects of climate change.
- 2. The Long-Term vision goals are **key elements in planning and defining** national policies and strategies.
- **3**. The implementation and monitoring of targets has **strengthened the technical capacity of agencies involved** and generated expert panels on climate change.
- **4.** The SIAT-PECC provides certainty to actions taken by responsible agencies and **contributes to national MRV systems** in climate change policy.
- 5. Has served as a precedent for **state governments to develop their own State Action Programs** to combat climate change

There are two instruments that ensure the continuity of PECC towards the future:

The **General Law on Climate Change**, published in 2012, recognizes the actions of PECC and consolidates special programs on climate change The Interministerial Commission on Climate Change (CICC), an area crucial to the development of climate change policies.
