One of the major outcomes of the 13th Steering Committee meeting of UNISS held in N'djamena Chad, was the identification of Water as one of the key accelerating factors to drive development in the Sahel among other key accelerators. Water is a fundamental component for sustainable development and a critical component for human health and survival, food and energy production, environmental sustainability, transportation, and manufacturing. Overall, water is the lifeblood of healthy ecosystem's stability and conservation for which present and future generations depend. This is particularly crucial for the Sahel. As conceived in the UNISS vision paper, between 60% and 80% of the Sahel populations work in the blue and green economy (agriculture, livestock, and fisheries). However, a lack of shared and concerted natural resource management, limited access to land and water to all due to poor regulatory frameworks and policy as well as the risk multiplier effect of climate change are driving competition and conflicts over these common natural resources, limiting their economic opportunities, and threatening their livelihoods and jeopardizing social cohesion in the subregion across borders.



RATIONALE FOR THE DEEP DIVE WORKSHOP

Among the many resources that place the Sahel region as a mineral-rich region is Water, Water resources are one of the major opportunities in the Sahel and constitute an important catalyst of its socio-economic development. It is also a driver of resilience to climate change. This means that investing in water would help the Sahel region meet the ECOWAP results, the 2030 SDG target as well as the UNISS strategy and its support plan, the Africa Water Vision for 2025, the African Union's 2063 Agenda targets, the SDG6 global acceleration framework, the Water cooperation for peace and stability and the 2022 World Water forum declaration for a "Blue deal". Even if the Sahel has a limited number of large rivers, lakes and limited access to ocean water, the Sahel region is home to large aquifers and reservoirs of underground water that could be used to accelerate the socio-economic development of the region.

To implement the recommendation of the UNISS Steering Committee members regarding the choice of development accelerators for the Sahel region, the UNISS Co-chairs are organizing a one full day deep dive workshop to unpack and prioritize actions identified in the technical paper prepared by the UNISS experts from the Resilience Working Group. Upon exploration of the horizontal aspects of the relevance of water - as a development accelerator, it is envisioned that the outcomes of the discussions will translate into developing a Global Sahel action Plan on Water as well as an Advocacy Plan to advocate with States to adopt/integrate into their national development plans at national and local levels. It will also be used to developed concrete programmatic interventions by the United Nations for subsequent advocacy with relevant other development partners including International Finance Corporations (IFIs), etc.



OBJECTIVES

The overall objective of the deep dive session on water as an accelerator is to continue the conversation that started at the last UNISS steering committee meeting in Ndjamena in May 2022 to jointly agree on two or three main ticket items drawn from the UNSP and the UNISS Vision Paper or even beyond those, that UN AFPs can coalesce around to spur accelerated implementation of UNISS for the benefit of the Sahelians. As a result, the deep dive sessions are framed within the framework of advancing the UNISS Agenda by articulating key critical accelerator components and use their findings to develop integrated programmatic actions for the UN, States and other key partners working in the region including regional entities, Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs), and other development partners.

EXPECTED RESULTS AND OUTCOMES

It is expected that the following results will be produced at the end of the deep dive workshop: (1) Main actions on water as a development accelerator that the United Nations can coalesce around to support partners and Governments are identified and agreed upon; (2) A Road map of actions and deadlines for the implementation of the above point are agreed upon, including consultations with the UN Resident Coordinators on how the identified actions fit or can be linked to the national development plans or priorities; (3) Key discussions and recommendations of the workshop are used to inform the development of (i) A Sahel Action Plan on Water and (ii) An Advocacy Plan for the United Nations.
