Small and medium scale industry

- Fokus on bricks, ceramics and 3rd sector in 5 provinces
- 500-1000 energi audits
- Financing mechanism for investments in 150-250 concrete EE projects
- MRV system

Buildings

- Implementation of building code in new large buildings
- Capacity building at ministerial and provincial level

STYRELSEN

- Preparation of demonstration building
- MRV system

VNEEP indicators by sector (SME industry: bricks, ceramics, 3rd.)

- Energy managers network established end 2013
- No. of energy audits done
- No. of enterprises that implement EE measures
- Benchmarks established by sector

Output VNEEP SME industry (bricks, ceramics, 3rd)

- 500-1000 SMEs are aware of EE potential, technical solutions, sources of technical and financial support within at least 3 sectors
- 30-50 service providers competent and available for the 3 sectors
- 150-250 EE investment projects implemented
- Long term commercial partnership established





VNEEP indicators building sector

- No. and % of new buildings that apply EE measures as regulated (100% in 2015)
- No. of workshops/training events to promote energy efficiency standards and design
 - No. of trainings held for EE managers
 - No. of trainings helds for building staff to apply BC and building design
 - No. of tranings held for enforcement staff





Output VNEEP building sector

- Mechanism established for regulation (BC and supportive circular)
- Capacity increased at MoC and related agencies for implementing the BC leading to gradual compliance for all new buildings by 2015
- A fundable proposal for a demonstration project is presented by the end of the project
- A partnership mechanism is in place enabling MOC and others to access state of the art policy and regulatory competence from DK within EE and low carbon transition in buildings



Possible elements of a strengthened MRV system?

- Measuring energy and emissions reductions from the 150-250 implemented investment projects
- More focus on measuring side benefits, eg. job creation, health effects, reduced pollution, poverty reduction, gender aspects, etc.
