





The capacity awards programme targets: young and mid-career professionals who are

- already in public service sector
 and
- nationals of and working in a small island developing State (SIDS) or
- nationals of and working in a least developed country (LDC).





What are the C.A.P.A.C.I.T.Y. Fellowship expectations?

Lessons learned through building capacity of LDCs and SIDS through the CAPACITY fellowship

Expectations:

From the Fellows

- Obtain employer's approval of training and permission for leave of absence
- Certify return to institution for at least six months
- Produce a final report
- Come to the secretariat with an attitude to learn and develop

From the Hosting secretariat Team

- Develop suitable expression of interest
- Nominate a supervisor
- Monitor progress and make final appraisal of the Fellow



Provide training in professional expertise on climate change






