

Financing NAP Processes: Strategies and Case Studies for Engaging the Private Sector

Official Side Event at COP25 in Madrid, Spain Tuesday December 10, 2019 | 15:00-16:30

Hosted by Winrock International and the Government of Vietnam, this Side Event will explore how governments and implementing partners have engaged the private sector to support the development, financing, and implementation of National Adaptation Plans (NAPs). Speakers will showcase examples of how private sector entities can be engaged to understand opportunities of climate risk management, capture positive returns on investments, and identify and track the benefits to their respective organizations.

Michael Cote (moderator) is the director of the Private Investment for Enhanced Resilience (PIER) project (www. winrock.org/pier), implemented by Winrock International and funded by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Oceans and International Environmental and Scientific Affairs (OES). PIER supports leading-edge climate adaptation investment and finance activities in Bangladesh, Ghana, Guyana, Indonesia, Mozambique, Peru, Tanzania and Vietnam.

Dr. Antwi-Boasiako Amoah is a chief programme officer in charge of climate vulnerability and adaptation at the Climate Change Department of Ghana's Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Dr. Amoah is a lead member of the adaptation component of Ghana's NDC implementation team. An experienced climate change negotiator, he is currently the lead negotiator for G77 and China on national adaptation plans (NAPs). He is also deeply involved in the preparations of the national communications and biennial update reports in Ghana.

Dr. Tran Thi Thanh Nga is a policy professional in the department of climate change in the Socialist Republic of Vietnam's Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment. With experience in the private sector, financial institutions, project management and government policy, Dr. Tran Thi Thanh Nga is a key member of the national adaptation plan's (NAP) development team working to engage the private sector in the NAP process.

Vu Duc Dam Quang heads the department of climate change in the Socialist Republic of Vietnam's Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment. A specialist with five years' experience in free trade agreement negotiations, Vu Duc Dam Quang leads the national adaptation plan's (NAP) technical and implementation team.

Alec Crawford is a Senior Policy Advisor and Lead, ECP with both IISD's Resilience and Economic Law and Policy programs. Alec leads the IISD's work on Environment, Conflict and Peacebuilding.
