- 4. Promote meaningful inclusion of Indigenous Peoples, girls, youth, and other historically excluded groups in land rights decisions within the NDCs.
- 5. Issue a call to action for governments to incorporate land rights into their NDCs and for funders to provide financial support for this effort.
