What is the Energy and Climate Registry?

- An on-line voluntary registry for energy consumption and carbon emission reporting in China.
- Based on successful models in California and USA, and especially tailored for Chinese application.
- A tool that produces reliable, transparent verifiable and standardized information for multinational and state owned enterprises, as well as governmental and local entities.
- An important mechanism to help provincial governments and businesses to track and meet energy efficiency targets.
- A tool to create a common standard for measuring and managing supply chain carbon emissions and energy usage.
- ECR allows enterprises a chance to showcase environmental performance.

What does the ECR offer?

- The ECR Reporting Protocol – a user guide and reference book for all members.
- The ECR Reporting Software – to help members accurately and easily report their GHG emissions and energy use online.
- Opportunities to pursue internationally standardized third-party verification.
- Access to technical assistance from our expert staff in person or through a telephone hotline.
- Access to expert, ECR-approved consultants for members with large or complex operations.
- Membership in a network of like-minded, forward thinking environmental leaders.
- Receipt of invitations to conferences, workshops and seminars covering the larger context for GHG management.
- Email alerts to provide up-to-date opportunities for members in the area of GHG management and climate leadership.
