- Government Resolution № 332 of 28 May, 2007 «Procedures of approval and supervision of projects implemented under Article 6 of Kyoto Protocol to the UNFCCC»

3 decrees of MEDT of 30 November:

- Methodological Guidelines
- Sectoral limits for ERUs
- Commission

- Government of Russian Federation
  - JI projects approval
  - Designation of federal authority for project's supervision
- Ministry of Economic Development and Trade (MEDT) = Russian DFP
  - Administrate JI approval process
  - Develop Methodological Guidelines for projects consideration
  - Approve list of IEs
  - Approve and re-distribute sectoral limits for ERUs
- Competent federal authorities
  - Participate in consideration of projects
  - Supervise project's operation and monitoring

- Commission
  - Composition: MEDT, Roshydromet, MNR, MIE, MRD, etc.
  - Decisions to be made public within 10 days after each meeting
  
- Tasks of the Commission
  - Consideration of project applications on compliance with Russian legislation
  - Selection of IEs to be included in the list
  - Recommendations on re-distribution of ERUs sectoral limits

1. Application cover letter
2. Project document (PDD + project risks and risks mitigation options)
3. Determination report by IE from the list approved by MEDT
4. Project passport (project summary + efficiency indicators)
5. Copies of legal documents (registration certificate, charter, tax registration)
6. Proof of finance availability (debt/equity)
7. Confirmation of no tax arrears
8. Confirmation/consent of project site owner
9. Contact info for project managers
10. Project implementation plan
