







 - Enhance access to funds




Mexico City Pact, Art. 4

Cities registered towards a low-carbon, climate-resilient future.

The carbon *n* Cities Climate Registry (cCCR) helps cities and local governments make climate commitments the world can count on. The cCCR was developed *by* local governments *for* local governments.

The cCCR enables cities and local governments to publicly register their greenhouse gas reduction **commitments**, report **performance** and showcase **actions**.

The cCCR ensures that local climate action is **measurable**, **reportable** and **verifiable**, and that data are consistent with the standards of the global climate regime.

The cCCR supports the global credibility of local climate action and ensures transparency, accountability and comparability.



The carbon n Climate Cities Registry is launched at the World Mayors Summit on Climate, 21 November 2010 in Mexico City.

cCCR Signatory Cities (138 as of 21.11.2010)

Express <u>willingness to disclose</u> information on commitments, emissions and actions (Signatories pursuant to Art. 4 of the Mexico City Pact)



cCCR Pioneer Cities (5 as of 21.11.2010) Sign the Mexico City Pact <u>and start</u> reporting *commitments, emissions* and *actions* through carbonn


