


Lessons learnt from the CDM

- 6,147 proposals for CDM project activities submitted for validation and/or registration by the CDM Executive Board
- Only 0,6% (37 proposals) have been submitted as 'transport' projects



• CDM is by design not fit for transport!




Cancun Agreement – Opportunities for Transport


- Mitigation actions NAMA as a key vehicle
- Climate finance Towards a transport window
- Technology Mechanism Beyond fuel and vehicle solutions – a transport system perspective needed
- Capacity building Key for establishing sustainable low carbon transport
- Adaptation Transport as a crucial element within National Adaption Programme of Actions (NAPAs)



Developments by Parties on transport NAMAs





Key messages

- Looking beyond the CDM (and project based crediting mechanisms) to properly finance transport NAMAs
- Blending several types of **financing** to effectively support a basket of measures that contribute towards sustainable transport
- Institutional capacity building as a way to improve absorptive capacity of support towards transport NAMAs in developing countries
- The NAMA Registry to support, and not act as a barrier to the implementation of transport NAMAs
- Countries to further benefit by working together, through e.g. the "Transport NAMA Working Group" hosted by the Partnership on Sustainable Low Carbon Transport (SLoCaT) and Bridging the Gap
