

## Low carbon transport under different regimes?

Friday 5<sup>th</sup> 2008 18.00 – 19.30

Transport is part of the problem but it is also part of the solution - this follow-up event hosted by GTZ, UITP, UIC and TRL will present cutting edge developments from the transport sector.

Financial and institutional changes will be highlighted and the role of transport in the Post-Kyoto negotiations will be discussed. The side-event will emphasise the need for representatives from the transport sector to work with representatives from the negotiation process to find a common approach.

This side event will be a key kick-off meeting that will provide the background to a series of other transport events to be held throughout the second week. The side event is designed to be an interactive session to summarise key stakeholder positions and roles. A key objective of the event will therefore be to identify major pathways which should be followed-up during the negotiations.

Several key representatives from key organisations including the World Bank (Andreas Kopp), Asian Development Bank (Jamie Leather), Clean Air Initiative (CAI) Asia (Cornie Huizenga), CAI-LAC (Sergio Sanchez) and ITPS (Iwao Matsuoka) confirmed to join the side event.
