## Part II - The international context of climate education 14:00 – 14:30

The UK Presidency also announced its draft Sustainability and Climate Change strategy to equip and empower young people with the skills they need to drive the future of climate action. This includes the introduction of a Primary Science Model Curriculum, to include an emphasis on nature and the recognition of species, supporting the youngest pupils to develop conservation skills. The UK and Italy, in partnership with UNESCO, Youth4Climate, and Mock COP coordinated new global action to equip future generations with the knowledge and skills to create a net-zero world. As Education Ministers and young people gathered together, over 23 countries put forward impressive national climate education pledges, ranging from decarbonizing the school sector to developing school resources. Civil society, business leaders, and ministers also play a key role in the discussion on how all parts of society could be brought on board with the action needed on climate change.
