● carbonn Cities Climate Registry is:

- *based on the experience* of voluntary local climate action dispersed globally,
- *inspired by the vision* of Local Government Climate Roadmap
- *built upon the success* of the Copenhagen World Catalogue of Local Climate Commitments
- *guided by the provisions* of International Local GHG Emissions Analysis Protocol
- *linked to the enhanced global climate action* now, up to and beyond 2012

● carbonn Cities Climate Registry helps local governments to:

- demonstrate leadership
- initiate a process to have direct access to global climate funds

Group - B Cities that:

Sign the Mexico City Pact and start reporting *commitments, emissions* and *actions* through carbonn



Carbonn Cities Climate Index that:

will feature reports from Group-B Cities and rank the performance of leading cities
