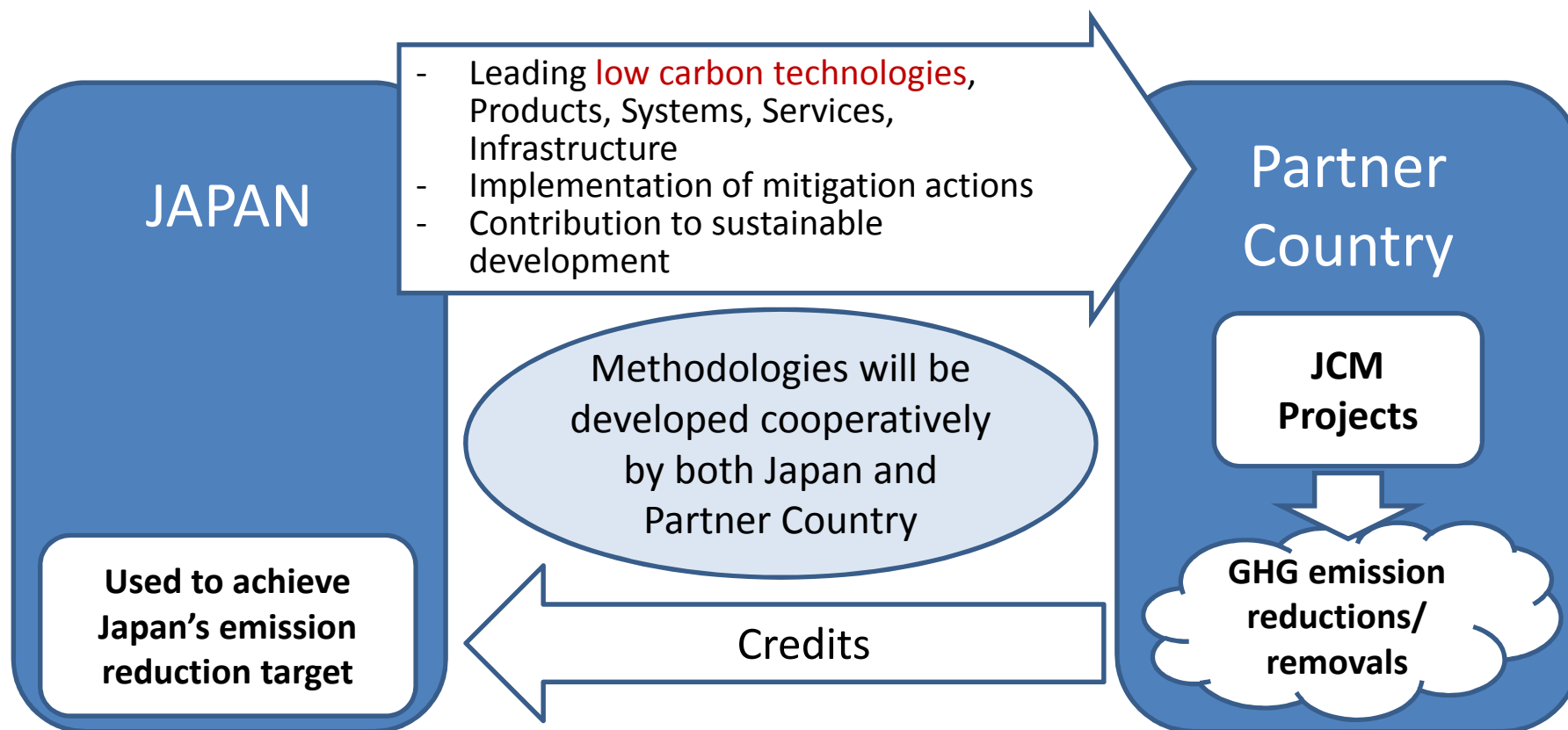

Purpose of the JCM/BOCM

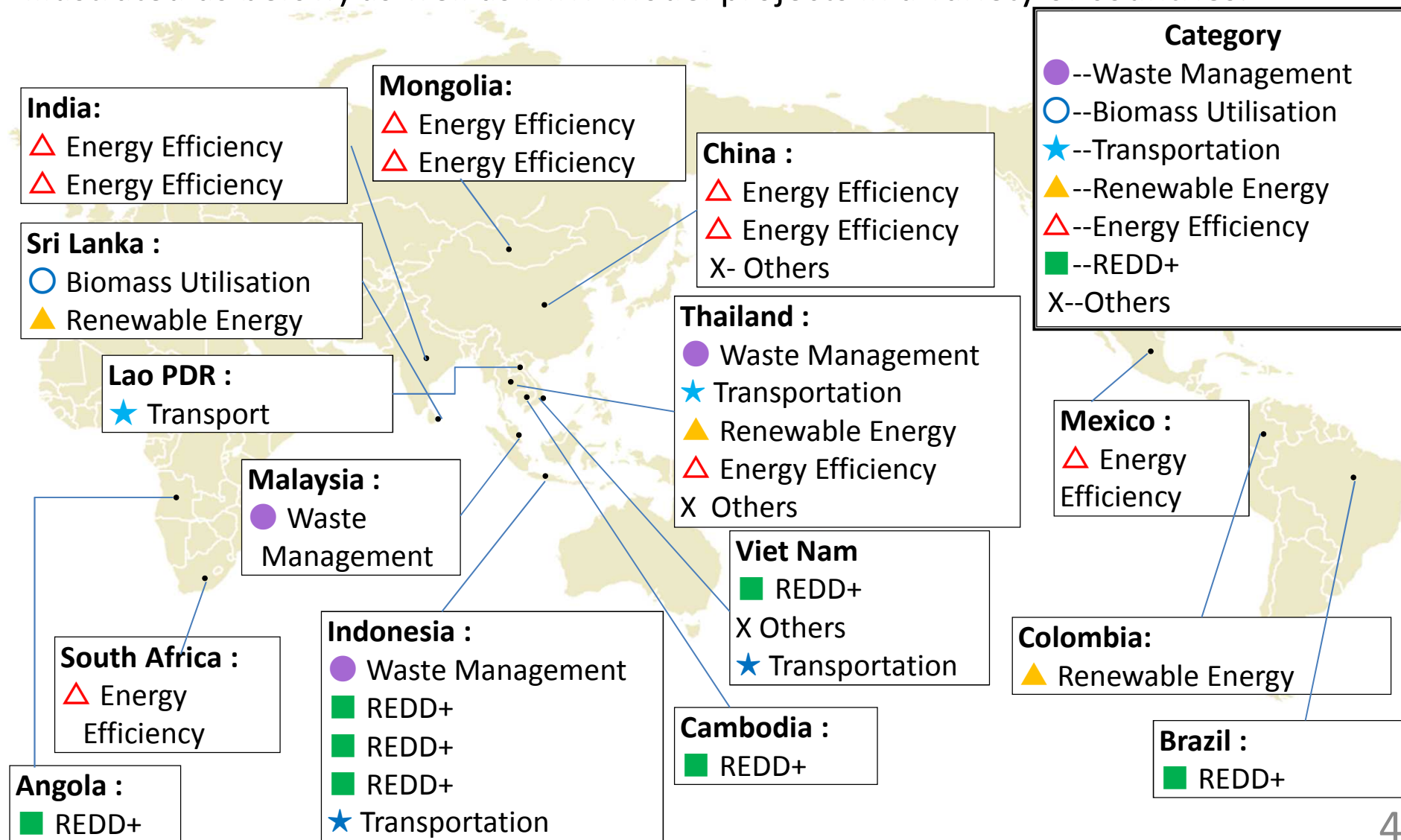
Through JCM/BOCM, Japan has facilitated diffusion of leading low carbon technologies, implementation of mitigation actions.



- ◆ To contribute to the ultimate objective of the UNFCCC by facilitating global actions for emission reductions/removals.

JCM/BOCM Feasibility Studies by MOEJ in FY2011

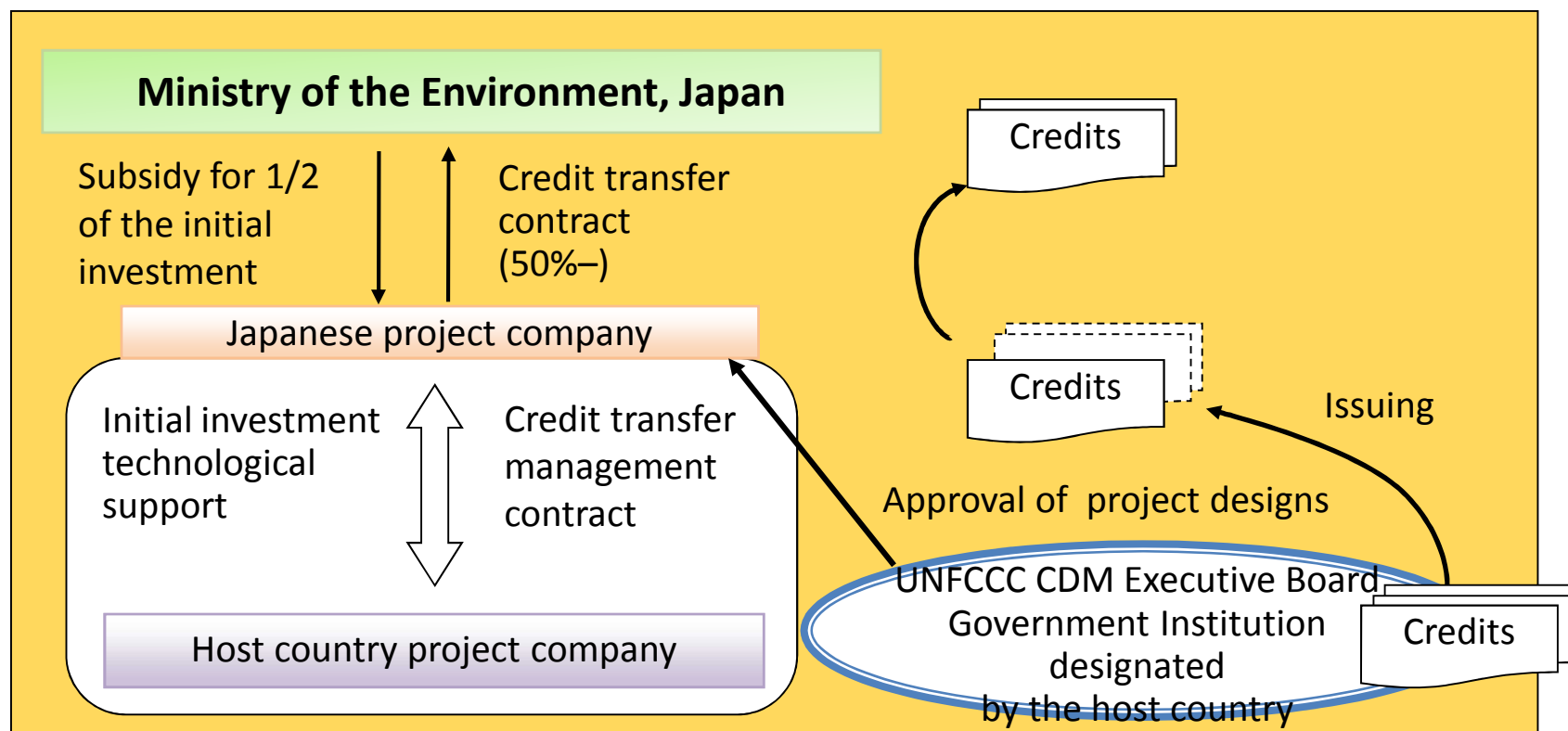
Ministry of the Environment has been implementing JCM feasibility studies (as illustrated as below) as well as MRV model projects in a variety of countries.

Co-benefits CDM Model Projects

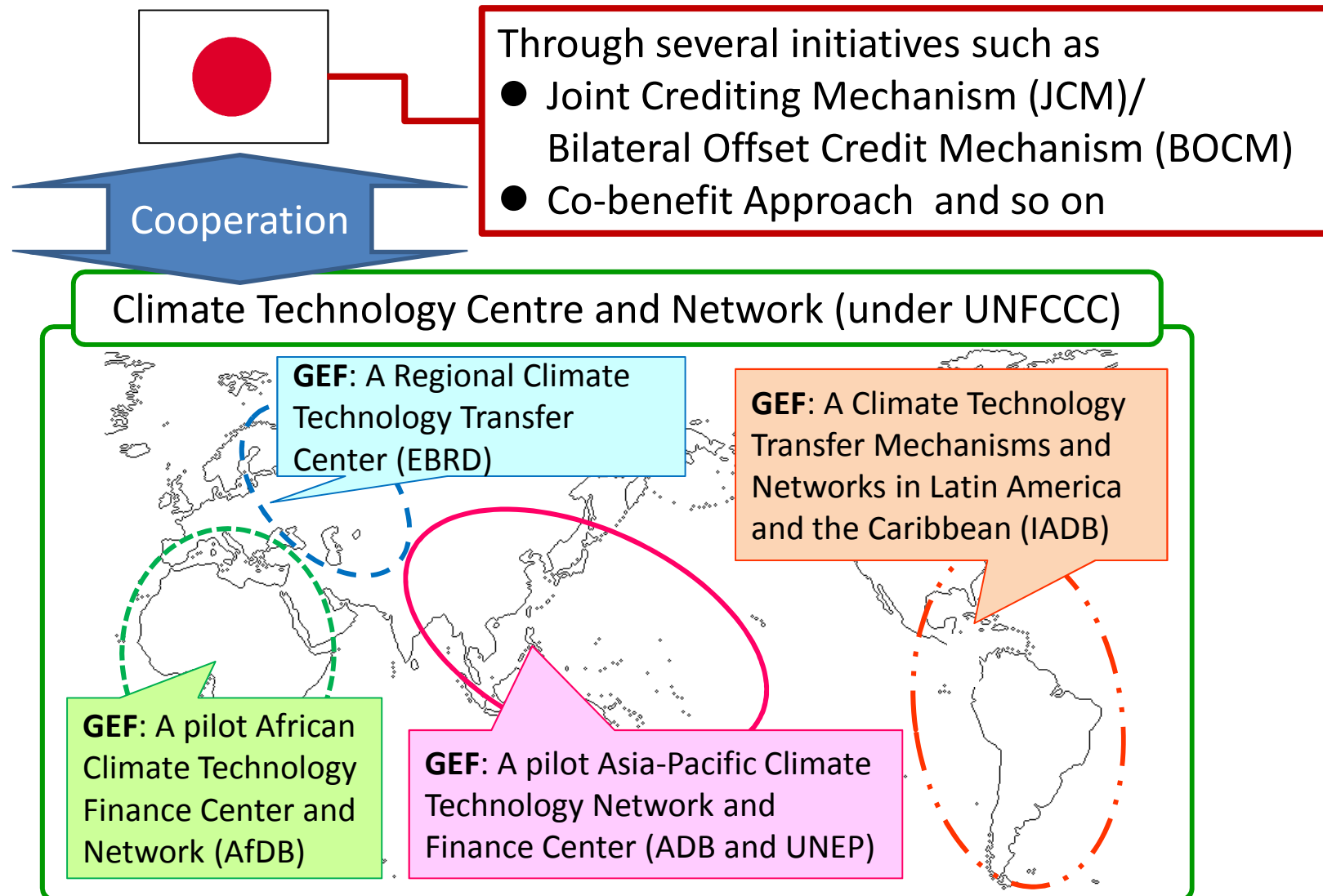
Ministry of the Environment has provided a subsidy program to support CDM model projects with co-benefits.



- ◆ Subsidy for half of the initial investment and transfer of half of CERs to the Government
