There is an urgent Need To respond to climate change in the Arctic and Small Island Developing States

- +The IPCC 4th Assessment (2007) reported that the Arctic and SIDS among the most vulnerable to climate change
- +Ecosystems and the animal, plant and human life they support are vulnerable
- +Climate change is a human rights and human security issue
- +People in the Arctic and SIDS have a right to have their voices heard

Builds capacity and alliances in the Arctic and SIDS to support the voices of people in these regions in international climate change negotiations

At the UNFCC negotiations, MSV provides communications support, organizes public events, and helps draft language for participants in negotiations.





What does MSV do?



Raises awareness about the effects of climate change on vulnerable regions in general and on the Arctic and SIDS in particular
