Capacity-building programme - background

- At COP26 (2021): CMA.3 requested the secretariat, including through its RCCs and in consultation with Parties and the Supervisory Body, to design and implement a capacity-building programme.
- At COP26 (2021), CMP.16 authorized funding for capacity-building in developing countries to apply the mechanism and transition from the CDM.
- Between COP 26 and 27 needs assessments through webinars, surveys, DNA forums, regional climate weeks, Parties consultations via mandated workshops, 6.4 SB consultations.
- At COP27 (2022): launch of the work programme on capacity building for Article 6.
- In March (2023) the Supervisory Body adopted additional measures integrated with the capacity-building programme to support the transition of eligible CDM projects.
