The Paris Agreement calls on countries to engage in adaptation planning and implementation. The National Adaptation Plan (NAP) process, which enables countries to define and address their medium- and long-term climate adaptation priorities, is therefore important to meeting the goals of the Paris Agreement.

Indeed, the NAP process can be leveraged for implementing various pieces of the Paris Agreement. Specifically, NAP processes can be used to:

- Update and enhance the adaptation component of NDCs, and/or
- Develop an Adaptation Communication, and/or
- Develop the adaptation section of Biennial Transparency Reports

All of these can likewise communicate a country's commitments and progress towards achieving the global goal on adaptation

This event will focus on initial frameworks linking these mutually reinforcing relationships and highlight some early experiences from developing countries in using their NAP processes to implement the Paris Agreement.
