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e7-UNEP Partnership

- MOU signed at the World Summit in Johannesburg :
 - Jointly identify, develop and support sustainable energy initiatives in developing countries
 - Provide and leverage resources to promote the efficient and sustainable generation and use of electricity in developing countries, particularly rural electrification and poverty alleviation

- Build strong partnerships with the private and public sectors to promote sustainable energy project activities, in accordance with the Millennium Goals
 Declaration
- Foster capacity building at the local level in host countries





Joint activities

- Rural Electrification Scheme Workshop
 - February 23 to 25, 2005 in Bangkok
 - Feb./March 2006, Nairobi
- CDM joint workshops and participation in each others events in Africa, Asia and Latin America

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Rural electrification workshop



40 rural electrification experts from ten South-East Asian countries attended the three-day workshop D

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Workshop objectives

- Objectives:
 - Identify the main challenges of rural electrification, based on a review of project experiences covering all stages of the cycle
 - Review best practices and determine effective approaches by which to address the challenges of rural electrification in the local context
 - Specify roles that e7 members and other stakeholders can play in ensuring that rural electrification projects are consistent with sustainability principles
 - Improve the ability of rural electrification project developers to develop project proposals that are eligible for e7 funding and/or technical support







Workshop structure

- The Workshop was composed of sessions on:
 Public Private Partnership for Promotion of Rural Electrification
 - Project Identification
 - Project Development
 - Project Implementation
 - Project Integration
- Numerous case studies were given by country representatives



Examples of Workshop Requests for e7 technical support

- Control of power-lines with the help of infra-red equipment
- Assistance in the development of cost-effective systems for billing and revenue collection
- (publish a "best practice" manual); many rural electrification systems are far from the billing office, remote reading (by satellite?) would be of interest
- How to prevent power theft and limit losses in power transmission
- Publication on "best practice" or "good governance" in utility management
- Instruction in the financial management of projects and the development of "bankable" business plans would be of interest
