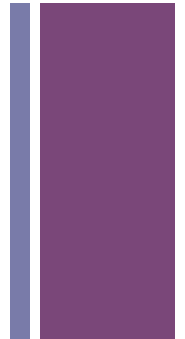
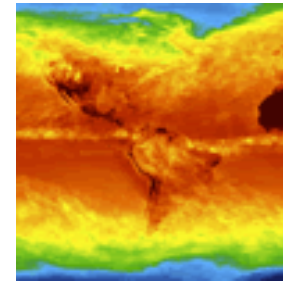

Yes We Can!

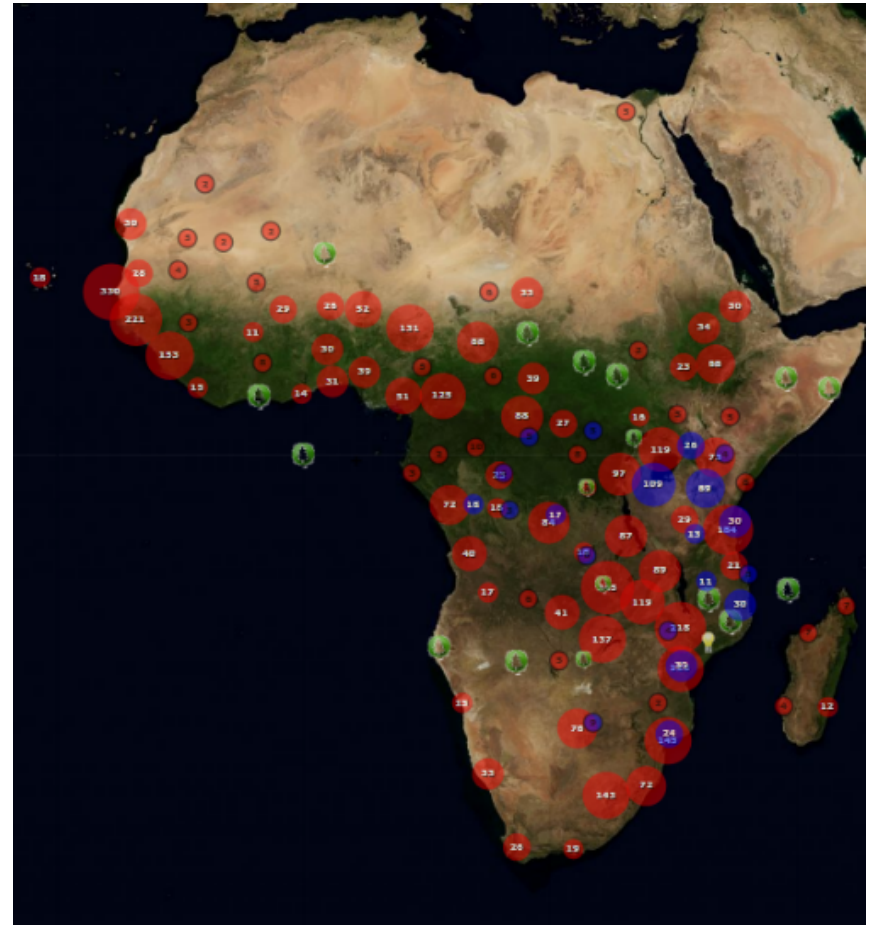
Climate finance is fragmented. But we can:

- Create a quantum leap in transparency and increased participation in monitoring and effectiveness



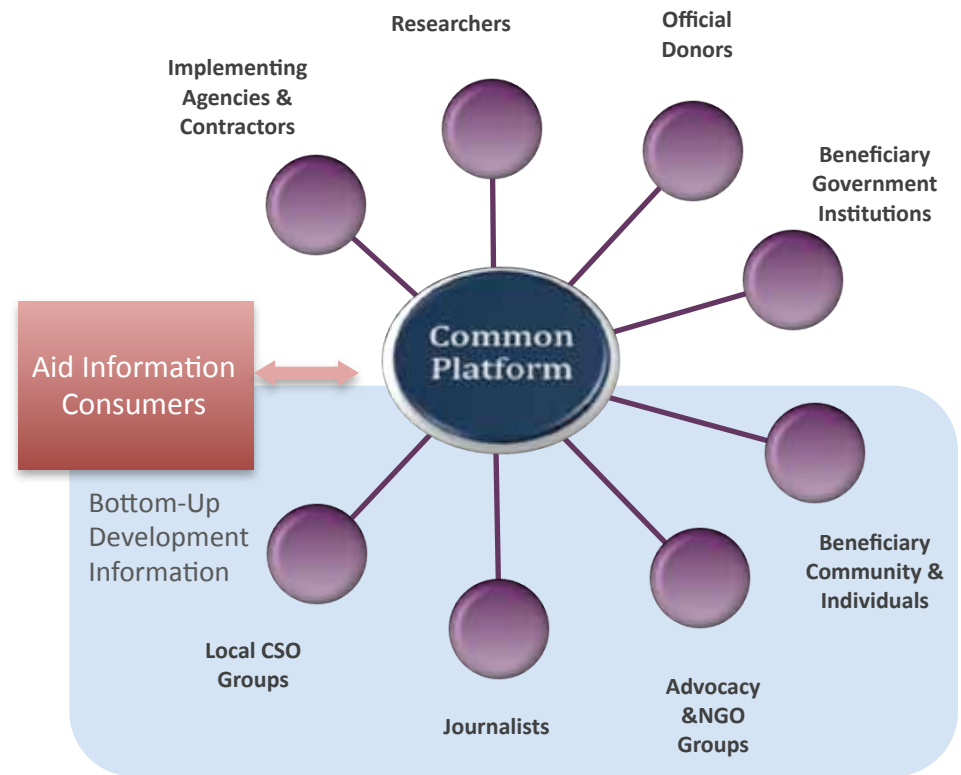
+ Mapping climate finance...

- Shows allocation within countries
- Highlights gaps and clusters
- Enables donor coordination and strategic planning
- Empowers partner countries and civil society
- Flexible—used by development agencies and private foundations
- Adopted for the International Aid Transparency Initiative standard



+ Crowdsourcing

- Information on climate finance and outcomes is often disbursed
- A common platform can connect donors, civil society and beneficiaries with climate finance information
- Users can “crowd” around a project to comment or post additional information



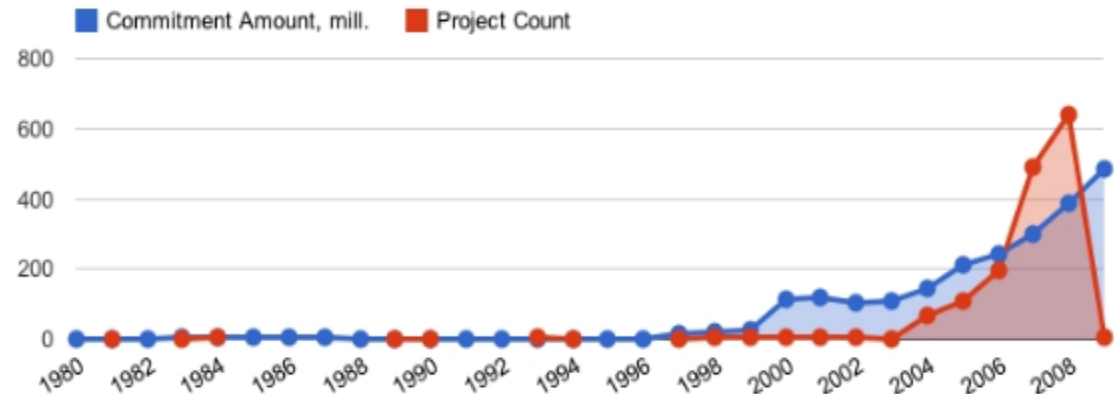

2010-11 -- CCAPS—Univ. of Texas/MINERVA Africa vulnerability and fragile states—identification, georeferencing, enhancement of adaptation project information
