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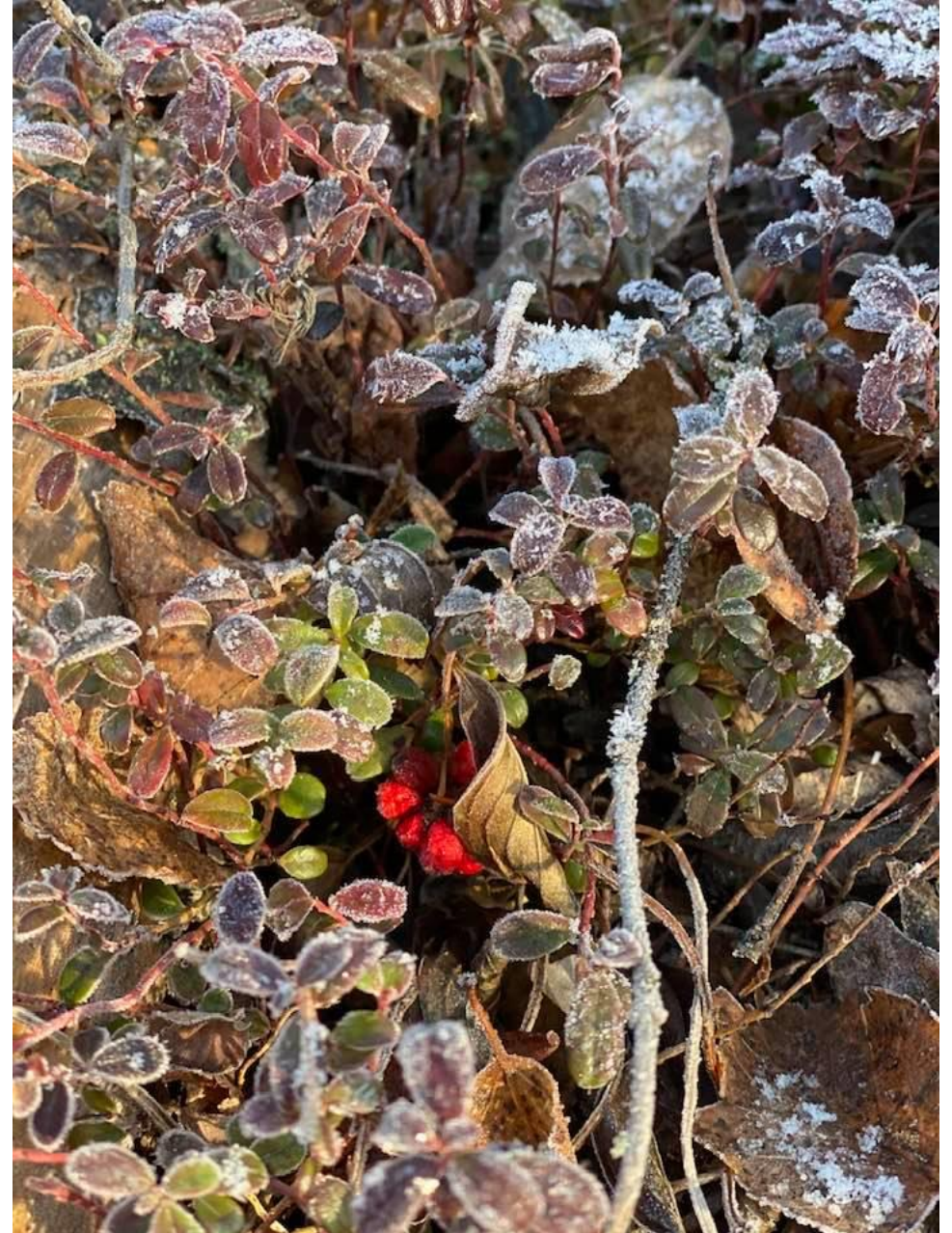


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Quality of CCE

 - Imperative to understanding and undoing impacts of colonization, genocide and epistemicide
 - Validation of Indigenous knowledges
- What CCE can entail in and with Indigenous communities
 - Indigenous land-based education is climate change education





Quantity of CCE

- The importance of increased quantity of CCE globally
- Increased role of education in addressing CC, and as it relates to Indigenous communities
 - Undoing systemic violence
 - ‘Nature-based solutions’ may further promote neo-liberal approaches (ICA)
 - Indigenous sovereignty is climate action (Idle No More)

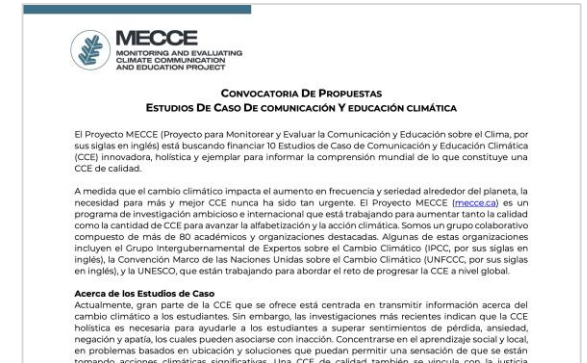
Indigenous Knowledges & the New ACE Work Programme

The MECCE Project: Call for Case Studies Proposals

- We are seeking proposals to carry out Case Studies of innovative CCE, including engagement with:
 - Social learning and local, land-based solutions
 - Climate justice, including disproportionate impacts on Indigenous and racialized communities, Global South, women, other historically marginalized groups
 - Range of initiatives that impact learners in all life stages
- Knowledge will be shared with policy makers, practitioners, and researchers to help further understandings of quality CCE/ACE
- \$10,000 CAD per Case Study, 10/year for 3 years
- Deadline: January 4, 2022

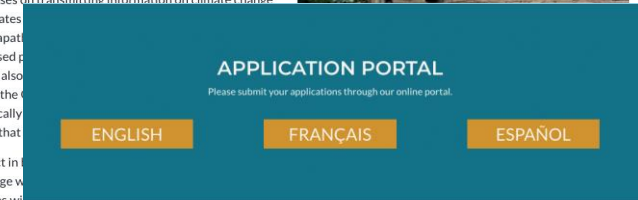
The Monitoring and Evaluating Climate Communication and Education (MECCE) Project is seeking to fund Case Studies of innovative climate change communication and education (CCE) to inform global understandings of quality CCE.

As climate change impacts increase in frequency and severity world-wide without adequate societal action, the need for CCE has never been more urgent. The MECCE Project is a global collaborative research program working to increase both the quality and quantity of CCE to advance global climate literacy and action. We are a partnership of over 80 leading scholars and agencies, including the IPCC, UNFCCC, and UNESCO working to tackle the challenge of quickly advancing CCE globally.

ABOUT THE CASE STUDIES

Currently, much of the CCE being offered focuses on transmitting information on climate change to learners. However, the latest research indicates that such one-way communication can help learners overcome feelings of loss, anxiety, denial, and apathy. Focusing on social learning and local, place-based practices can help learners take meaningful climate action. Quality CCE also addresses the disproportionate impacts of climate change in Indigenous communities, and for other historically marginalized groups.
