## Invitation for a WWF side event

WWF's "Blueprint Germany. A strategy for a climate safe 2050"

The global temperature has to be limited to a 2 degrees Celsius increase compared to preindustrial times, if we want to avoid the most disastrous impacts of climate change. For this purpose the industrialized countries need to reduce their greenhouse gases by 95% compared to the level of emissions in 1990. So far no country has developed an implementation strategy. The study by WWF entitled "Blueprint Germany. A strategy for a climate safe 2050" could close this gap. It outlines a road map for the climate protection target 2050 and shows that emission reductions by 95% are feasible and affordable. The way of living may change, but not dramatically, even though we have to reduce our per capita  $CO_2$  emissions from 11 tons today to less than 0.5 tons per year.

The required technical measures and political instruments are described in detail for every domain, from nutrition to mobility. Germany - as one of the leading industrialized countries of the world - could demonstrate that a climate friendly economy is possible, and become a role model for other countries.

We invite you to a panel discussion with 3 speeches from varying perspectives of decarbonisation in industrialized and developing countries. We would be pleased to discuss this issue with you further.
