#### **Experiences in reporting on financial resources**

- Bilateral and multilateral channels remain essential for provision of financial resources
- Bilateral financial support continues to focus on mitigation (in particular on energy, transport and forestry)
- Funding for adaptation increased for many Parties compared with that reported in NC4 (in particular on water management, water supply and sanitation, as well as vulnerability assessment)
- Enhanced support for the use of the flexible mechanisms of the Kyoto Protocol



#### **Experiences in reporting on transfer of technologies**

- Support for mitigation and adaptation focuses on R&D and innovations in developed countries, on knowledge sharing and fostering enabling environments in developing countries
- Partnerships between various stakeholders considered as an effective channel for the successful transfer of technology
- Capacity-building as an integral part of most of the technology transfer programmes and projects
- Increased initiatives to facilitate private-sector participation in the transfer of technologies
- Success factors: capacity-building, cooperation with local stakeholders and favourable enabling environments



#### Challenges in reporting financial resources: "new and additional"

- "New and additional" not always defined and, if defined, different approaches used
  - a) Different definitions used, for example:
    - increases in contributions to the GEF
    - funds pledged in the Bonn Agreements on the implementation of the Buenos Aires Plan of Action
    - Fast track financing under the Copenhagen Accord
  - b) No benchmark to assess if the definition has been applied (i.e. share of ODA and non-ODA support)
  - c) No clarity how the provision relates to the UN objective of 0.7 per cent of GNI for ODA
  - → Development of concepts and approaches on how "new and additional" could be defined



#### Challenges in reporting financial resources: comparability

- Difficult to compare with the previous submission of a Party and across Parties due to:
  - a) Different reporting timeframes used by Parties
  - b) Reporting using local currency and without taking into account the inflation
  - c) The 2-3 years lag between actual status and information reflected information in the national communications
  - d) Changing the scope and coverage of reporting
  - → Development of common reporting format including uniform timeframes and accounting methods



#### Challenges in reporting financial resources: transparency

- Difficult to separate financial flows to mitigation and adaptation due to:
  - a) Various approaches used to distinguish financial resources for mitigation and those for adaptation
  - b) Reporting on some additional categories for adaptation, such as water supply and disaster preparedness
  - → Development of uniform categories and criteria for financial flows for mitigation and those for adaptation



### Challenges in reporting technology transfer

- Reporting on technology transfer that occurs through private sector channels remains a major issue
  - a) No obligation for private sector to report to the Governments
  - → UNCTAD reports might be used as a reference
  - b) Growing initiatives by the Governments:
    - To facilitate private-sector participation in the transfer of environmentally sound technologies
    - To cooperate with and strengthen the "green" private sector in developing countries
  - → These initiatives may serve as a source of information



### Possible ways forward

- Streamlining the reporting guidelines with a view to provide more detailed guidance to Annex I Parties to address these transparency, completeness and comparability challenges by using:
  - a) The existing experiences of use of the OECD/DAC "Rio Marker" system
  - b) Information from existing data bases: UNCCD, UNCBD and Ramsar Convention
  - c) Examples of existing reports by several Annex I Parties
- Development of concept and approaches, in cases where detailed definition could not be identified
