COP27 SIDE EVENT

Thursday, 10 November 2022, 13:15-14:45

1. OBJECTIVE

The purpose of the event is to showcase the progress countries have made in facilitating access to and mobilization of climate finance for needs and priorities as supported under the Needs-Based Finance (NBF) Project – a work programme carried out by the secretariat and funded by donors in response to two decisions under long term finance take at COP 23 and COP 26.¹

The NBF currently covers 100 countries in 12 participating regions and has supported countries to assess their needs, determine how finance has flowed to date, designed, and adopted strategies with actions to address the gap in finance needed for priorities that are aligned with NDCs, national adaptation plans and other relevant regional policies.

The event will highlight experiences of countries supported by the NBF and provide an account of progress made in facilitating access to and mobilization of climate finance.
