Title: Climate Resilient Water Sector in Grenada (G-CREWS) Proposal Prepared by: GIZ (AE), Grenada's NDA, the National Water and Sewerage Authority (NAWAS), Ministry of Finance (EE), Ministry of Agriculture, Ministry of Climate Resilience, and Grenada Development Bank (EE)

Duration: 01/07/2019 –36/06/2025

Funding: ~42 million EUR (approx. 35 million from GCF)

Main Goal: “Systemic Climate Change Resilience in Grenada’s Water Sector, by applying a Multi-level Approach, Addressing the Resilience at the level of Water Governance, Users, and the Water Supply System”

Paradigm shift required, with interventions not focusing on supply side measures only, but using a multi level and multi-sectoral approach



Strategic Interventions

- Climate-resilient water governance
- Resilient water users
- Resilient water supply systems
- Inclusion of citizens, businesses and farmers, water utility and public sector
- Appropriate governance and regulation.
- Regional learning and replication

CONCLUSIONS

- Almost impossible for SIDS to develop on their own.
- The expectations and requirements for the climate rationale are very demanding
- Given the staff capacity and available resources à strong reliance on international AEs or need for funding through GCF (e.g. within Readiness windows or PPF).
- **RECOMMENDATION:** Separate window with quick approval process for VAs for projects to be developed by DAEs from SIDS and LDCs.
