# Barriers for LULUCF projects

- Limited access to equity and long term loans due to high country financial risk, little acceptance of LULUCF project collaterals, the asset class and long investment periods without returns
- Project development requirements and barriers are often unclear to project developers in the region resulting in high project development costs and associated risks
- No transparent internal and external market for carbon credits thus lack of political and financial incentives
- Limited capacity of organisations & service providers to develop implement LULUCF projects



# Opportunities for LULUCF project developer



- Countries in the region are gifted with nature (high potential for ecotourism, timber and bio-power production and payments for environmental services)
- If respective products and services are professionally delivered according to recognised standards the value of the assets will be recognised
- Community based projects delivering conservation and ecosystem services can fetch high premiums in niche markets
