The role of non-state and subnational, or 'non-Party' actors, is gaining increasing attention in climate governance. Efforts by such actors present an enormous potential to spawn a multiplicity of solutions and to accelerate low-carbon and climate resilient transitions. Marrakech Partnership for Global Climate Action is playing a key role in mobilizing and demonstrating non-state and subnational solutions.
