Objectives of ACEWA and Justification

Objectives of the project

Strengthen the implementation of regional policies and strategies on access to sustainable energy in West Africa for the most disadvantaged

- > Promote the integration and implementation of these regional strategies into national strategies
- Contribute to the ownership of these policies and strategies at the national level
- > Important to have tools and organize advocacy messages











Context

- ➤ More and more RE projects in WA: AIRE, SE4ALL
- > Interest of foreign investors for the potential of RE
- Respond to the need for access; target of the 35% mix in 2020; fight against climate change; ODD7
- Probable acceleration of the trend
- Problem: Social impact for people: skilled jobs; access to energy; regulation on independent producers; land protection; etc.
- Environmental and Social Impact Assessments (ESIA): lack of monitoring of Environmental and Social Management Plans (ESMP)











ACEWA Project: just and sustainable transition

- Urgency to find just and lasting answers for the most disadvantaged / local residents
- Initiate dialogues on local content in project countries
- Identify examples of good practices to promote
- Share experiences of taking into account the social dimension
- Determine an approach for an inclusive, just and sustainable response











Results of Preliminary Dialogues

Some orientations and recommendations (Senegal)

- Identification of good practices
- Need for wider and inclusive local governance
- Establishment of a quality control system and impact monitoring, including for ESMPs
- Provision of impact monitoring tools based on the SDGs
- Training of sellers / installers and maintenance staff; reach a critical mass of skilled technicians
- Hold public consultations with decentralized services
- Reflect on the best approach to land allocation and compensation that benefits all
- Elaboration of a Guide for local governments backed by the SDGs
