UNCCD mandate included in the GFCS

 The MDG package of climate impact leads directly to Drought, Desertification and Land Degradation (DLDD)

DLDD is

- most sensitive to rainfall, temperature patterns / variations
- DLDD is a major concern of the intended users of the global framework for climate services



- The UNCCD 10-year strategic plan (10YSP)
- Partnership building: in making the framework operational through regional approaches
- Institutional capacities: identify and respond to risks



- Territorial Governance, decentralization
- Data generation and use by land users
- UNCCD Committee on Science and Technology
- Policy development and synergy



- Role of water within the mandate of the convention
- APF on drought and water scarcity to be adopted in 2013
- Options for land neutrality: ZNLD
- The CST and the high level segment of the UNCCD sessions of the Conference of the Parties (COP): to assert political commitment to this effect



UNCCD as part of the solution to today's challenges:

Human activities that cause land degradation, (influence land productivity, water cycles and drought patterns)
Human activities that impact amount of carbon in the atmosphere and biodiversity loss

Policy responses on:

Food-water-energy nexus through: resilience building, increased efficiency and social inclusiveness
GFCS provide a necessary tool for addressing DLDD
Rio+20 may provide additional needed support to integral solutions when linking social, economic and environmental development to sustainable development.
