



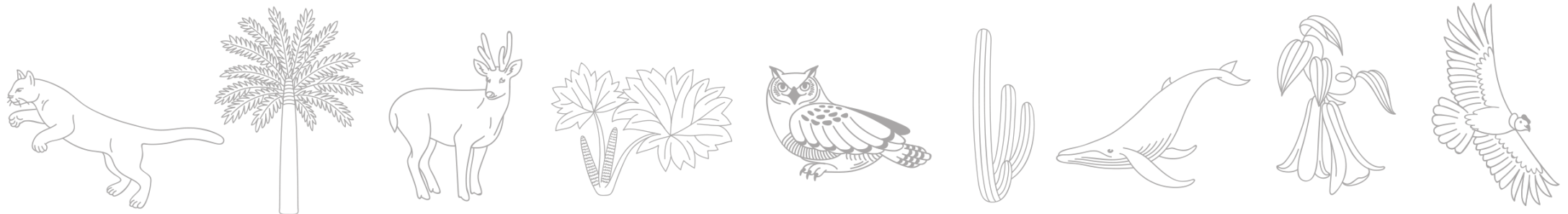

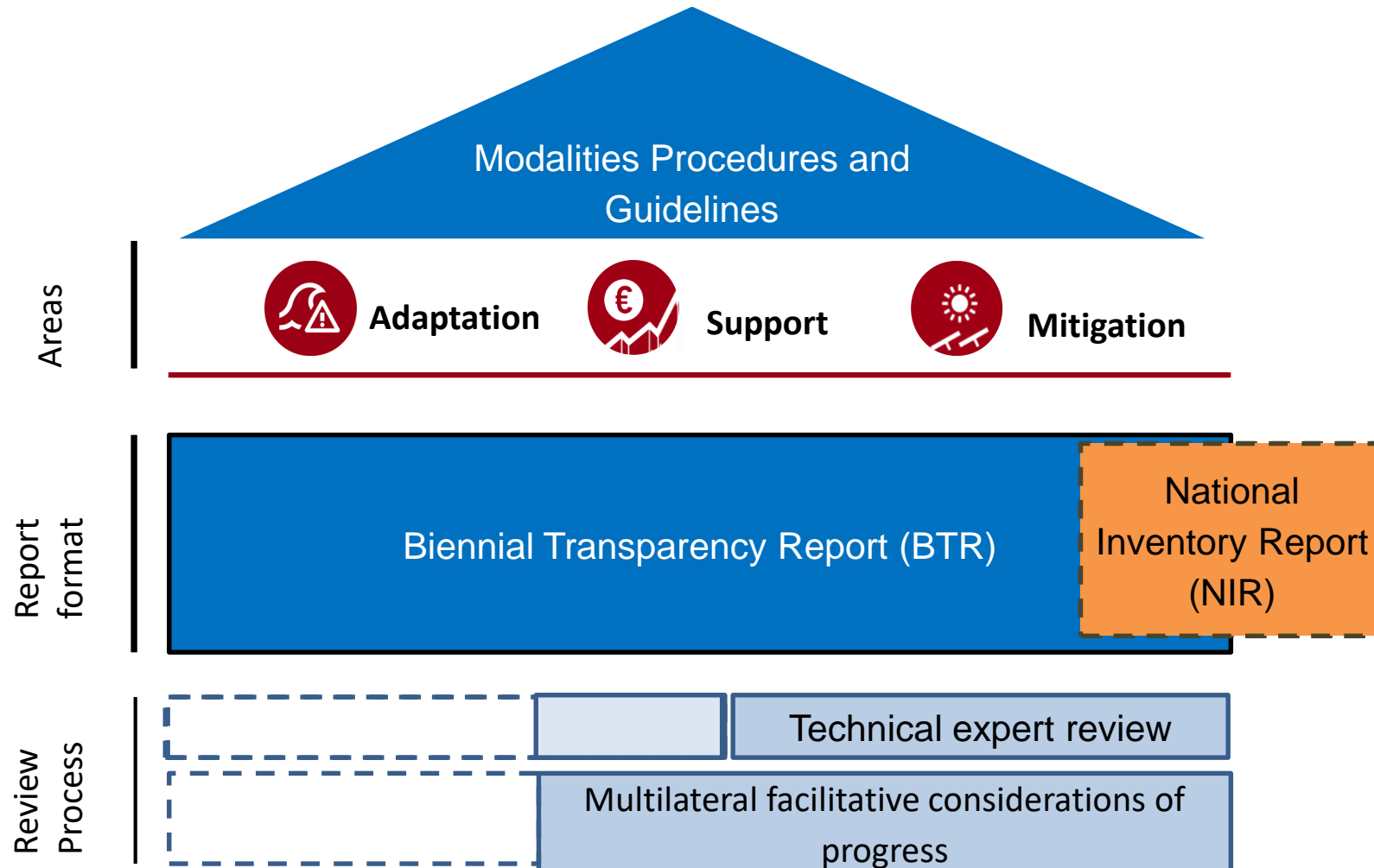

# Enhanced Transparency Framework (ETF)



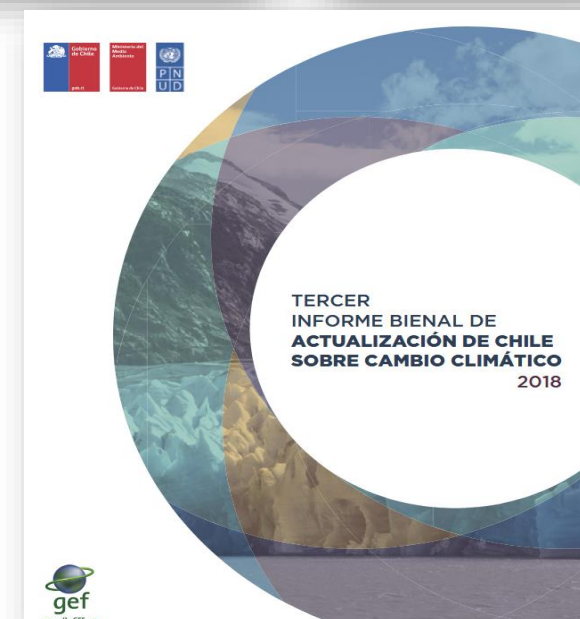
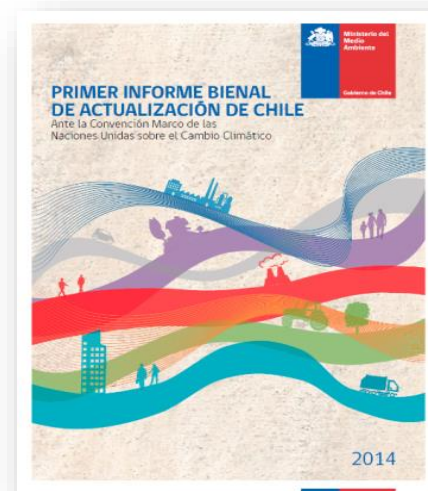
For flexibility identify:

- Use of each flexibility provision
- Capacity needs related to its use
- Time frame for improvements related to those needs
- Report and monitor the areas of improvement identified by providing information on any progress made.

# Chile's National Biennial Update Reports

- **Chile has submitted 3 BUR from 2014**
- **First Country to submit its 3rd BUR**
- **All Reports have been presented on time**
- **Additionally 3 NIR has been submitted**

**The all 3 BURs have been submitted on time and have built a permanent mechanism of domestic reporting in a yet voluntary basis .**



# Chile's 3rd BUR



- **Presented jointly with REDD+ annex and the NIR annex**
- **It contains a national ghg inventory from 1990 to 2016**
- **Present important sectoral policies which support Chile's climate effort improvement**
- **Analyzes the outcomes from previous ICA process**



# From the experience of Chile: Take advantage of the current framework as a preparatory period

- Making national reports requires capacities and resources, however much progress can be made with current country structures.
- It is key to start working in the country reports as soon as possible. Learning by doing really works!
- Ensuring progress requires political will and commitment. International support has been an instrument to strengthen capacities.
- The information produced is key as input for the domestic analysis of climate policies and for the decision making process.
- There are new requirements that could be especially difficult to implement if there is not enough support for some developing countries (eg: projections).
