- Small business containers powered by 6 PV modules with 24V 1000Ah battery, 220V AC inverter
- For women driven micro-enterprises, in less resourced areas
- Possible services: retail of renewable energy and energy-efficient products, cell-phone charging, sewing, ICT centre, hair salon
- Integrated package, incl. technical skills and small business training for women
- Ownership models



Greenhouseproject South-Africa: Low-cost Rainwater Harvesting

- Improve access to water for poor women / households
- Directing roof runoff into a bank of drums, low-cost safe recycled materials
- For household use and irrigation of food gardens
- Reduction of urban runoff
- Training and monitoring, in particular water quality
- Partnership with the City of Johannesburg
