CLIMATE CHANCE ASSOCIATION :

Main activities:

- SHARING, RELEASING, SPREADING THE INFORMATION WITH THE PORTAL FOR CLIMATE ACTION: dedicated to local governments, private companies and civil society actors' climate action, it gathers together numerous resources by and for climate actors, among which three tools : cartography of climate best practices, climate library, climate agenda.
- ANALYSING CLIMATE ACTION WITH THE ANNUAL OBSERVATORY FOR NON-STATE ACTION: the Climate Chance Observatory publishes an annual Report on implemented climate actions headed by local governments, private companies, civil society and finance actors. It is also a year round observation through sectorial or countries, towns and regions case studies.
- GATHERING TOGETHER CLIMATE NON-STATE ACTORS: 5 international Summits since 2015 (including 3 in Africa) gathering over 5000 people and 80 different nationalities : the organisation of events and annual summits is in the association's DNA. It constitutes a moment of community convergence and the occasion to gather thematic coalitions. In 2020, in a restrictive sanitary context, virtual workshops were launched to pursue the mobilisation and the multi-actors work.
