- To provide relevant tools, training and assistance for meeting the provisions stipulated in Article 13 of the Agreement;
- 3. To assist in the improvement of transparency over time.



# Institutional arrangements for the Enhanced Transparency Framework

- Designated transparency institution has an organizational unit with standing staff
  - Single body responsible for overall coordination and management
- Unit has capacity to coordinate and implement transparency activities
  - Data collection, processing, management and analysis
  - GHG inventory preparation. quality assurance and control
  - · Track progress in implementing and achieving NDC under Article 4
  - Provide information on climate change impacts and adaptation under Article 7
  - · Report on financial, technology development and transfer, and capacity-building support needed and received
  - · Documenting and archiving processes and information
  - · Evaluation and prioritization of future improvements
- Institution has clear mandate or authority to coordinate activities under Article 13 of the Paris Agreement
  - · Formalized arrangements for the exchange of information, data collection and provision, and key responsibilities
  - I.e.: MOUs, legal instruments, data sharing agreements, etc.
- Activities are integrated into national planning and budgeting activities
  - Permanent national teams to carry out continuous work and meet two-year timeframe
  - · Ensures sustainability of built-capacity and ownership of process



## Lessons Learned: Building enhanced institutional arrangements

- 80% of CBIT projects aim to enhance institutional arrangements
- Most CBIT projects assess their institutional arrangements as:
  - Having an existing designated transparency institution, but with limited staff and capacity to support and coordinate implementation of transparency activities
  - Institutions lacking authority or mandate to coordinate transparency activities
- Process to building enhanced institutional arrangements:
  - Key stakeholders or relevant agencies must be clearly mapped out and their roles and responsibilities identified
  - Roadmap developed in alignment with existing national circumstances for the desired national institutional arrangement
  - Assess and implement most appropriate formalization arrangement
  - Enhance capacity to carry out transparency activities
