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1. Report of the International Workshop “CDM in the Post Kyoto Regime”

About the workshop

- METI, CRIEPI and MRI hosted “CDM in the Post Kyoto Regime” workshop on 22nd and 23rd March 2005 in Tokyo.
- Background: slow progress in CDM, particularly energy efficiency (EE) projects
- Purpose:
 - 1)review the current status of CDM; and
 - 2)identify work plan in cooperation with international experts to promote EE and renewable in developing countries

Participants

- International experts (15 from abroad and 5 from Japan)
- 20 DNA members from developing countries.
- Industrial representatives
- ENGOs (WWF Japan)

Findings

- CDM modality and procedures are complex and slow- some modification necessary; still,
- There are many opportunities within the current institutional framework under KP/MA.

- Roundtable for institutional arrangement of CDM (- left to other initiatives)
- Working group for sustainable development and CDM (- mixed views)
- Working group for policy instruments other than CDM (- left to other initiatives)

About “Future CDM” Project

- Following the recommendation by the Tokyo Workshop in May 22-23, 2005.
- Goal: Development of environmentally integral and high quality methodologies with wide applicability.
- Organization: The Future CDM Committee = 7 Governments(Brazil, Canada, Chile, China, India, Japan, Netherlands) and leaders of five Working Groups plus the Secretariat (CRIEPI/MRI).

Five Working Groups

- Consolidated methodologies for energy conservation (Leader: Axel Michaelowa, HWWA)
- CDM in the transport sector (Leader: Ken Yamaguchi, MRI)
- Common baseline emission rates (Leader: Agus Sari, Indonesia)
- Bundling Approach for energy conservation (Leader: Ernst Worrel, the Netherlands)
- ESCO-CDM (Leader: Datta Roy, India)
