# Forum on Readiness for REDD



- The Forum is a multi-stakeholder initiative focused on practical approaches for building REDD readiness through cross-stakeholder dialogue, South-South collaboration, and linking local expertise with regional readiness efforts.
- As Forum Secretariat, IPAM provides the administrative, research, stakeholder engagement, and other support to implement the activities of the Forum.
- It operates as a neutral convening space on REDD Readiness.
- The Forum is directed by an international Advisory Committee (members from private sector, developed and developing countries, intergovernmental agencies; civil society and Indigenous peoples).
- NORAD grants – 3 years' project (Aug.2013)



# Amazon Environmental Research Institute (IPAM)



IPAM is a Brazilian non-profit, independent research, policy and outreach organization that over the past 16 years has been working towards a sustainable development in the Amazon region that reconciles people's economic aspirations and social justice with the maintenance of its ecosystem functional integrity.

# Forum on Readiness for REDD



Activities that can be supported by the FORUM:

- Translation of key REDD documents to Southern REDD stakeholders;
- Travel support for developing countries representatives participate in the international, national or regional meetings related to REDD;
- Travel support to indigenous peoples and civil society representatives participate in the international, national or regional meetings related to REDD;
- Capacity and Support for Developing Country REDD negotiators – in partnership with FIELD;
- South-south workshops;
- National-Level Indigenous Network REDD and Climate Change Consultations in the 9 COICA Members Countries.





# COICA/Forum national-level workshops for Indigenous Peoples on REDD+



- Nine countries – nine workshops in three years
- Collaborators/presenters include WHRC, EDF, local NGOs and private sector representatives, UN-REDD and World Bank, national governments representatives.
