Navigating post-Baku Carbon Markets: **Bridging Implementation Gaps and Mobilising Private Finance**

With the adoption of the landmark decision on the operationalisation of Article 6 at COP29 in Baku, attention is now shifting to implementation – specifically, how the new rules will be applied on the ground and can create an enabling environment for enhanced climate action, ambition and mobilizing climate finance.

The session will explore the next steps for unlocking high-integrity, cross-border carbon markets and how governments and businesses can tap into the potential of new carbon markets under Article 6 to achieve the NDC targets. It will also examine how other policy developments – in particular the EU Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism – intersect with Article 6, and the implications for global carbon pricing strategies. Finally, the event will look at the future of REDD+ under the new Article 6 rules, and how nature-based solutions can continue to mobilise climate finance, while prioritising the needs of indigenous peoples and local communities.

Bringing together stakeholders from government, private sector, indigenous peoples and local communities, and research, the session aims to provide a clear picture of the path forward for implementation, and how the private sector can actively engage in the post-Baku carbon markets landscape.
