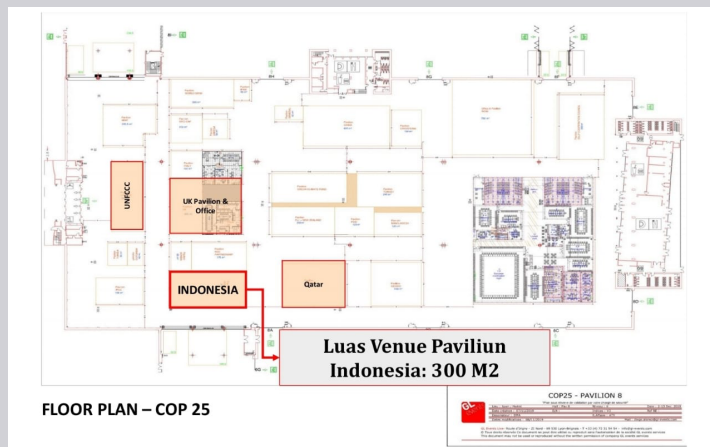

## TRAINING NATURE-BASED SOLUTION PROFESSIONALS

The Carbon Institute, in partnership with **RIFFEAC** (Réseau des Institutions de Formation Forestière et Environnementale de l'Afrique Centrale), **CATIE** (el Centro Agronómico Tropical de Investigación y Enseñanza), **RECOFTC** (the Center for People and Forests), and **USP** (the University of the South Pacific), is announcing a pre-launch of the **Collaborative Capacity Lab** at COP25.

As the global community increases ambition on nature-based solutions to climate change, there is a clear need to enhance training and workforces in many Non-Annex I countries. The Collaborative Capacity Lab (CCL) is a new network-of-networks designed to ensure countries have the workforce to implement, monitor, and report on nature-based solutions. The CCL will scale a proven train-the-trainer program piloted in six countries by the Carbon Institute to 42 countries. The CCL aims to train **400 new leaders** in nature-based climate solutions, mentor **24 faculty** (6 in each region), and qualify **160 new accredited UNFCCC experts** in IPCC AFOLU Greenhouse Gas Guidelines and UNFCCC ETF reviews by 2024.
