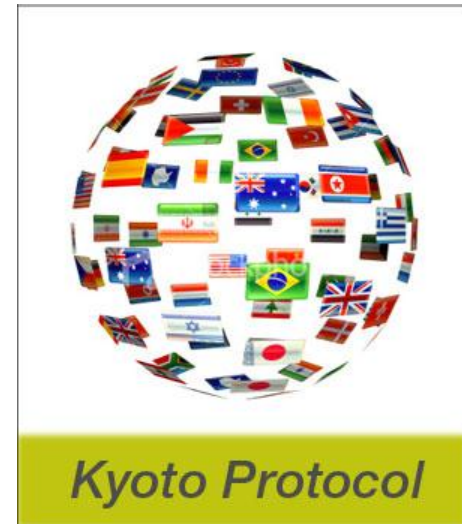

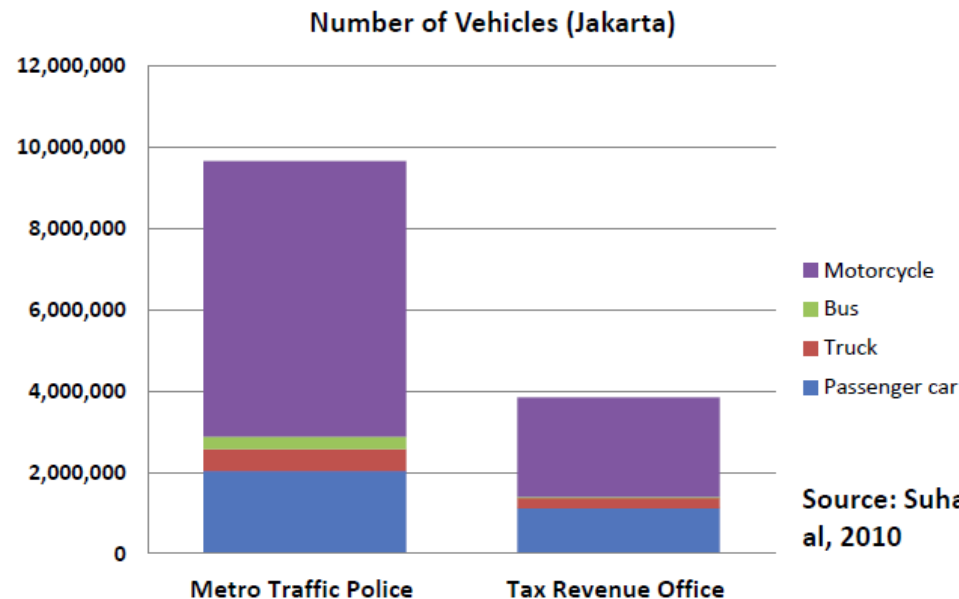

Transport MRV will be difficult

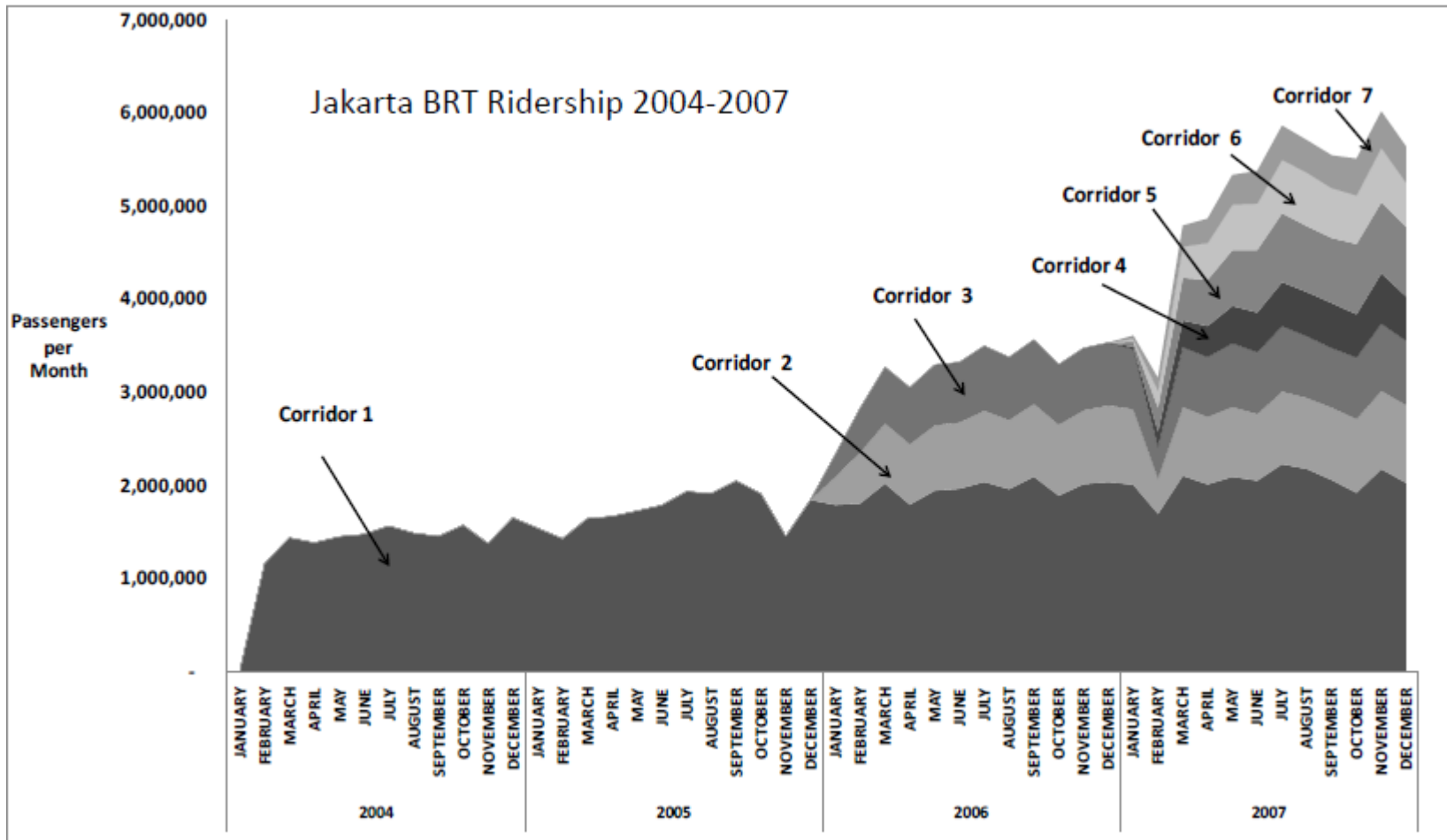
Asia is rapidly motorizing

Traffic demand calculation depends upon raw data



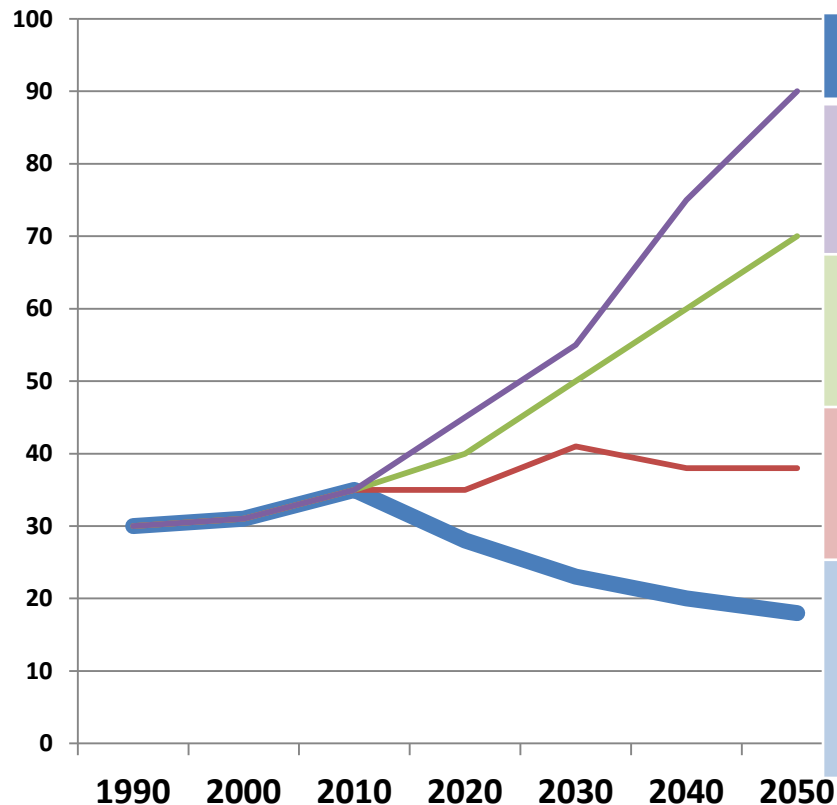
Transport MRV will also be important for Asia's Cities

Operationalizing Transport MRV will be important for the Climate

Global Emissions of CO²
(in gigatons annually)



Scenario	ppm	Temperature
Business as Usual	965	4.8 °C (2.9 °-7.7°)
Confirmed Proposals	755	3.8 °C (2.3 °-6.1°)
Potential Proposals	590	2.9 °C (1.8 °-4.7°)
Low Emissions Path	450	1.9 °C (1.1 °-3°)

Concluding Thoughts

- CDM works best when low transaction costs and high profit margins—not transport
- NAMAs and MRV holds more promise for transport...
- Asia could play an important role in operationalizing NAMAs and MRV

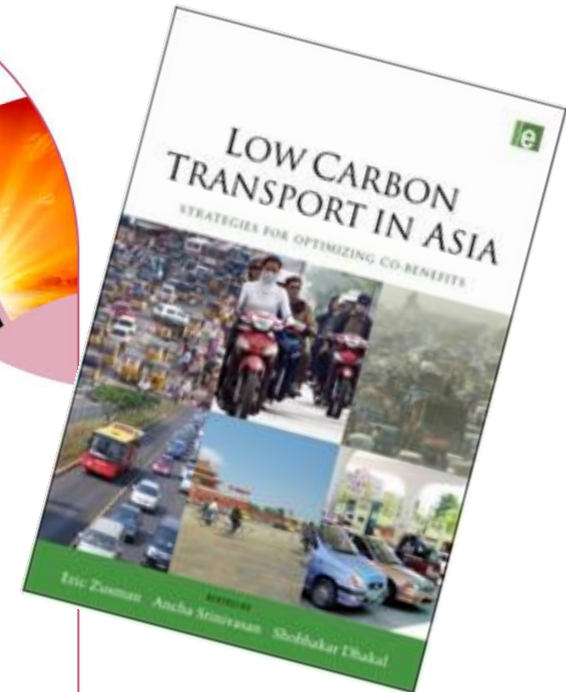
