# The Gold Standard

The Gold Standard ...

... provides a simple way of assessing SD benefits and demonstrating this in the market.

**It is ...**

- ... a set of add-on tools
- ... a label
- ... a non-profit NGO initiative
- ... free to use



**It is *not* a broker, buyer, fund or rating organisation**



# GS Criteria and Procedures

- **Criteria: a good project ...**
  - Renewable energy, energy efficiency
    - > et al.: biomass
  - clear additionality guidelines
  - Structured assessment of sustainable development benefits
  
- **Procedures:**
  - Built-in screens in PDD template
  - integrated DOE validation
    - > designed to minimise transaction costs



# Gold Standard ,Screens'

**Screen** = set of tools with defined quality thresholds; based on field-tested tools; reflect priorities of GS founders

## 1. Project type Screen

→ *Promotion of long-term shift towards sustainable energy systems*

## 2. Additionality Screen

→ *Secure emission reductions are real*

## 3. Sustainable Development Screen

→ *Guarantees locally adapted projects and SD benefits*



# Sustainable Development Screen

## Sustainable Development Assessment Matrix

# Benefits from using the GS

- > The Gold Standard is a **risk management tool**
  - globally applicable SD assessment
  - rigorous and conservative
  - participatory approach
  - NGO support
- > The Gold Standard is a **financing mechanism**
  - increased security of getting good quality, lower delivery risk and increased reputation has a value.



# Sustainable development services

## Non-monetary valuation of SD services essentials

- transparency
- global applicability, regional adaptation
- participatory approach
- **simplicity**



# Market experiences

- **Multiple objectives vs. price fundamentals:**
  - Additional instruments needed to demonstrate provision of an array of services
- **Market exposure**
  - Requirement for market-based approaches and procedures
- **Buyer segments**
  - Compliance buyers need appropriate legal frameworks; voluntary market needs benchmarks




# Conclusions

**„The real problem is, the CDM works perfectly!“**

- Market mechanisms alone insufficient
- no WTP for SD services without incentives for investors
- linkage to compliance schemes, CSR, image, marketing etc. as incentives
- high credibility of SD services assessment essential
