Pathways for a Secure, Sustainable Africa

The IEA discusses its forthcoming Africa Energy Outlook, highlighting key themes for energy system transformation and efforts to simultaneously achieve universal access, improved energy security and affordability, and reduce emissions consistent with its climate objectives and increased financial flows from international actors. The report aims to be one of the primary analytical sources available to African leaders in their preparations for COP27 in Egypt, providing the latest data on investment needs, energy mix, and financial flows to realise all African energy, climate, and development goals. This session will feature a panel discussion highlighting which priorities experts feel can be the top of Africa's agenda heading into COP27.

It will start with an opening remark from Mr. Tom Howes, Head of Energy and Environment Division of IEA, followed by a brief presentation on the initial findings of the forthcoming Africa Energy Outlook 2022 by Mr. Daniel Wetzel, Head of Tracking Sustainable Transitions Unit of IEA. The moderator will then open the session to the panel of four speakers. The session will end with brief summary remarks and a closing from the moderator.
