As ocean-based climate solutions gain recognition for their mitigation potential, this panel will convene experts and representatives to discuss the role of ocean-based carbon dioxide removal (CDR), the role of a scientific code of conduct, and opportunities for considering and integrating this topic across the UNFCCC agenda and work programs.

The need to act and find every means and technology possible to reduce emissions is mission-critical to meeting our climate goals. However, the complex nature of CDR, particularly ocean CDR, and its potential impacts require close examination and carefully planned action to avoid unintended consequences.

This side event will consider the complexities of ocean CDR and explore actions to understand the mitigation potential and potential socio-economic and environmental impacts. You'll be joined by scientists, representatives from non-governmental organizations, and technical experts who focus on ocean CDR, scientific research, and nature-based climate solutions to discuss the need for social, ethical, and financial considerations when implementing ocean CDR.
