To achieve climate neutrality by 2050, EU policy will have to be reoriented – from incremental towards structural change. As expressed in the European Green Deal, the challenge is to initiate the necessary transformation to climate neutrality in the coming years, while enhancing competitiveness, productivity, and employment.

Based on extensive analysis of the EU's existing climate policy instruments and governance, scientific experts gathered by the <u>4i-TRACTION project</u> have identified transformation gaps across the areas of **innovation**, **investment**, **infrastructure**, and **integration**. With a EU legislative cycle starting this summer, the EU has the chance to close these gaps and help all relevant sectors get to a path to climate neutrality.

This side event will present key insights and policy recommendations for closing the policy gaps and discuss them with an international audience, to gather an outside perspective and identify commonalities and differences in the challenges and potential policy solutions.
