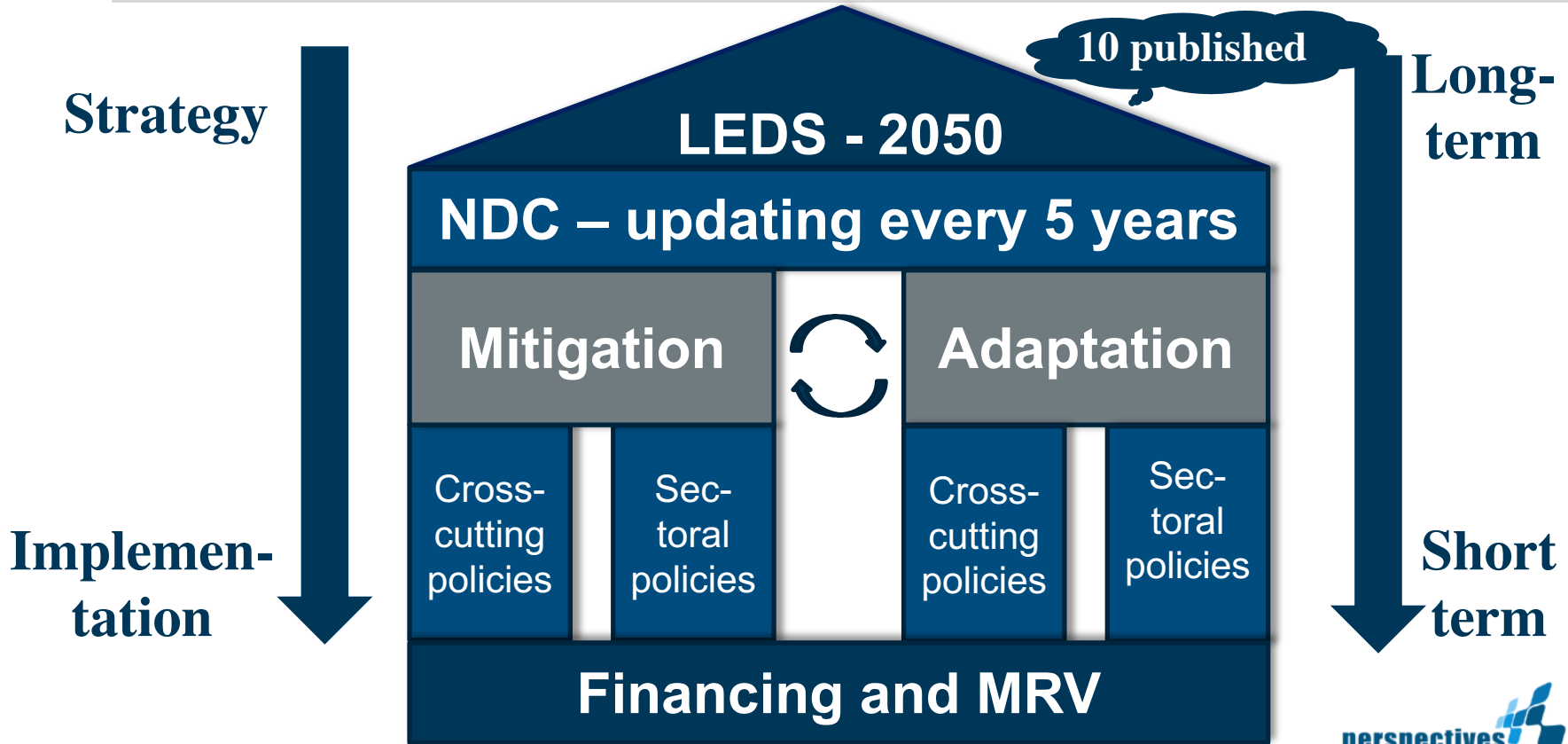
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The place of LEDS in mitigation policies



Lessons 1: *Elaboration* of LEDS

- Participatory and transparent interministerial process
- Integrate stakeholder views without allowing lobbies to block the strategy
- Insure consistency with NDC, current policies and feasibility of future measures and policies

Lessons 2: *Content* of LEDS

- Agreement on **generic scope**
- **Prioritization** of sectors
- Identification of **cross-cutting policy instruments** and **barriers** to be overcome
- **Prioritization** of measures; at least providing a criteria list for prioritization
- Consider **academic literature** and build on **generally accepted methodologies**

Lessons 3: LEDS *implementation*

- **MRV** methodologies and indicators
- Introduction of an **institutional framework** for monitoring
- Identification of **resource needs** and **realistic financing sources**
