

The place of LEDS in mitigation policies



Lessons 1: Elaboration of LEDS

- Participatory and transparent interministerial process
- Integrate stakeholder views without allowing lobbies to block the strategy
- Insure consistency with NDC, current policies and feasibility of future measures and policies



Lessons 2: Content of LEDS

- Agreement on generic scope
- Prioritization of sectors
- Identification of cross-cutting policy instruments and barriers to be overcome
- Prioritization of measures; at least providing a criteria list for orioritization
- Consider academic literature and build on generally accepted methodologies

Lessons 3: LEDS *implementation*

- MRV methodologies and indicators
- Introduction of an institutional framework for monitoring
- Identification of resource needs and realistic financing sources
