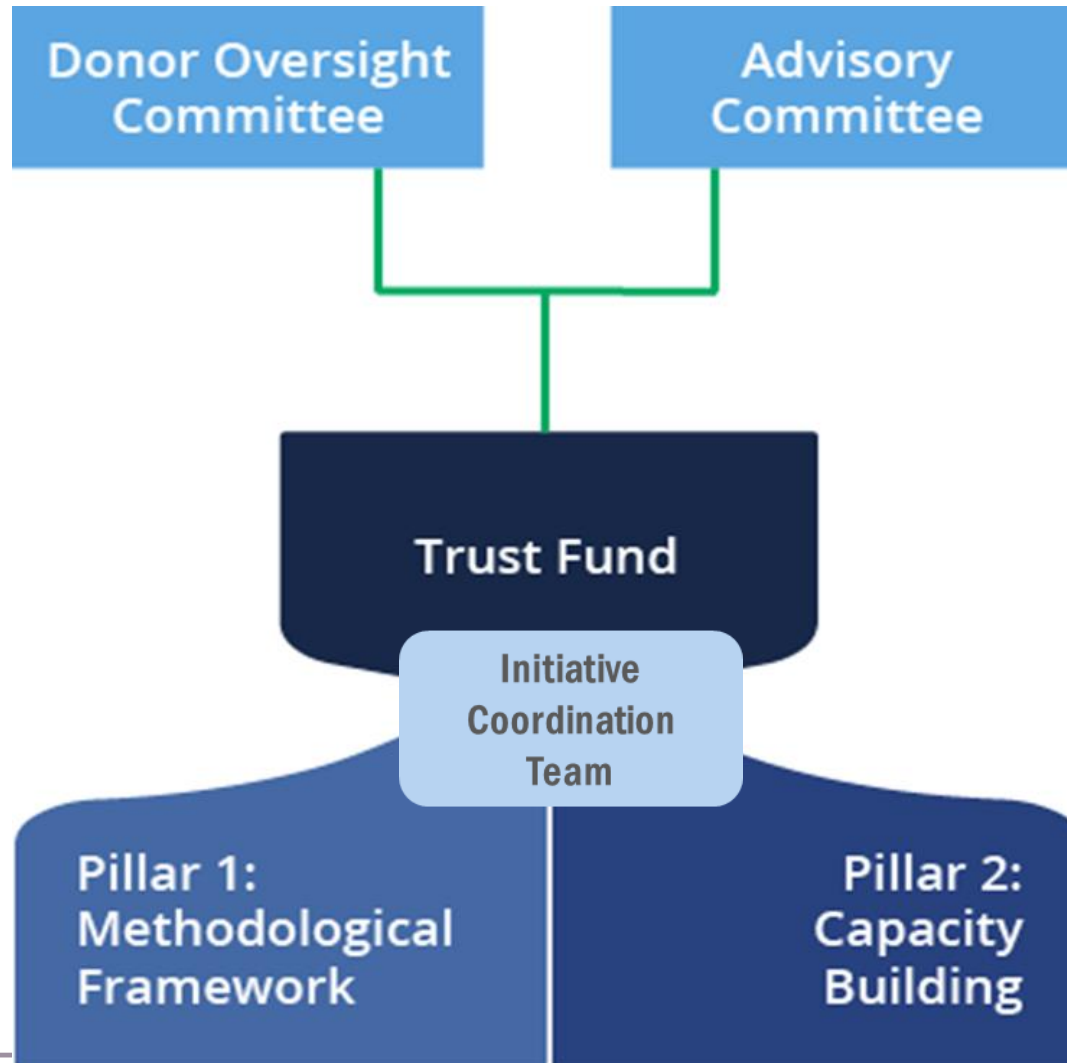
# ICAT objectives

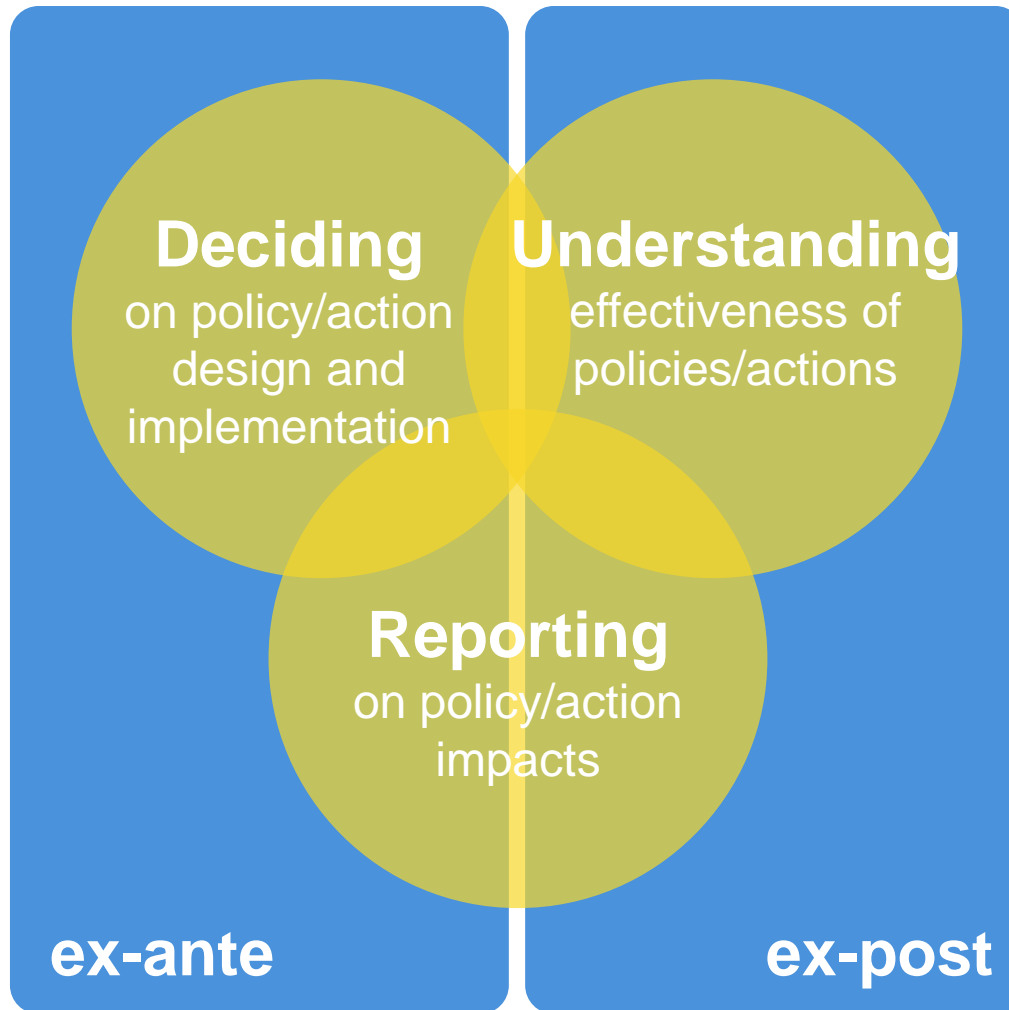

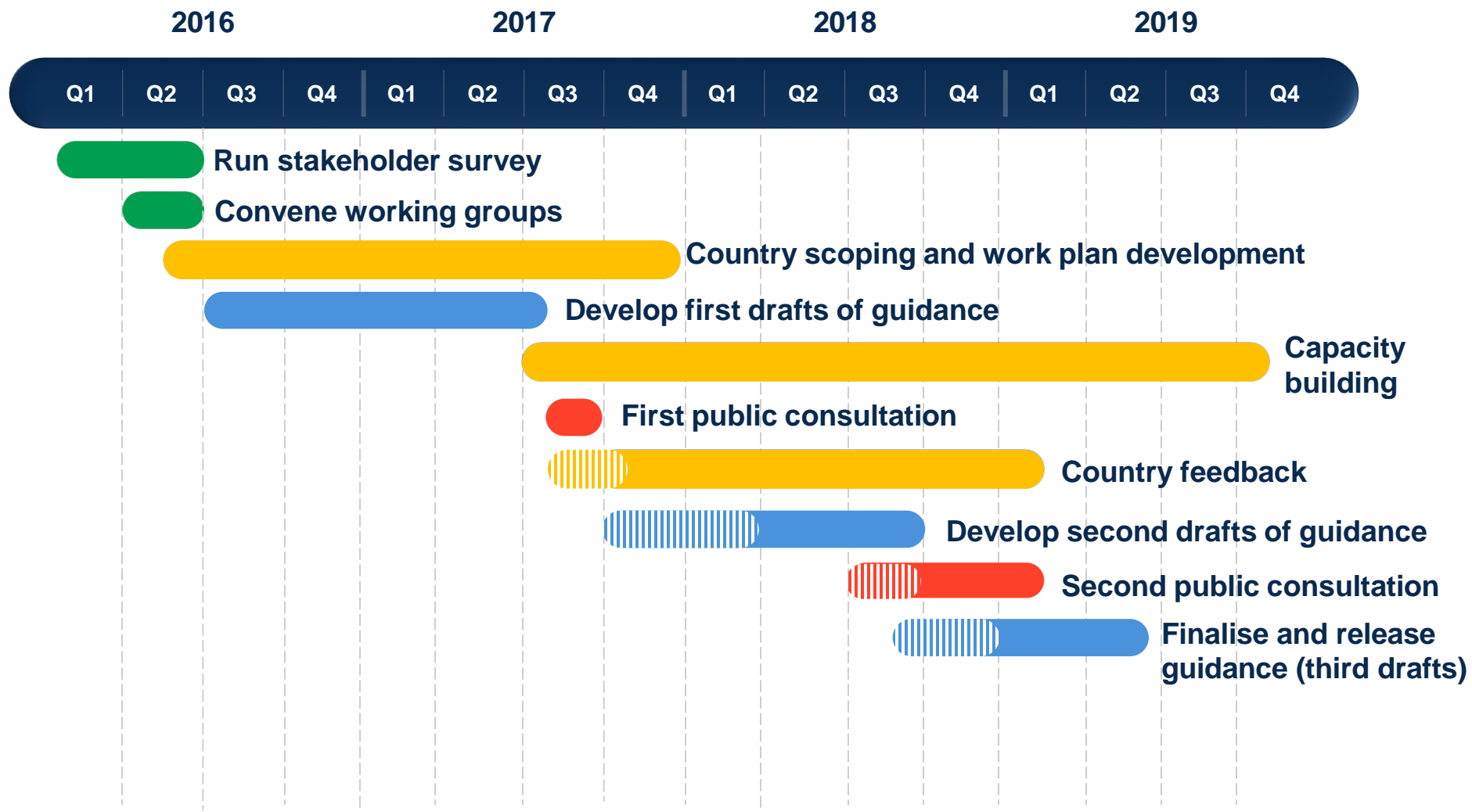

# Country Engagement Approach

ICAT offers:

- Flexibility in ICAT's 'topic approach' to adjust to and advance country national MRV plans
