Context

- Majority of GHG emissions in Non-Annex I countries energy or LULUCF-related
- Majority of CDM credits not in these sectors
- Calls for improvements to the CDM, which led to "further guidance" at COP/MOP1
- How can CDM encourage increased uptake of GHG mitigation in under-represented sectors?




What is PCDM, bundling?

 Bundles defined for small-scale: "bringing together of several smallscale project activities..."

Not defined for large-scale projects or PCDM

Potential overlap







What experience do we have with these in the CDM?

- Quite à lot: 27 registered CDM projects
- Characteristics different from single-site CDM projects:
 - Multiple sites (up to 100,000)
 - ◆ Potentially >1 sector
 - Potentially >1 project type
 - Sometimes >1 crediting period
 - Role of project participant
 - Monitoring provisions (sampling)



What is a programme of activities?

- In non-CDM context, "programme" covers wide differences in who, what, where, when, why
- In CDM context, need to clarify what sort of programme is eligible
 - some precedents already set...
 - ... but not for all potential project types
 - e.g. programmes initiated to implement a mandatory policy/standard; that involve "soft" actions; >1 host country





Is guidance specific to PCDM needed?

- Crediting period
- Ex ante identification of project location
- Ex ante calculation of expected emission reductions
- Additionality, baselines, doublecounting, leakage, boundaries, national policies



Conclusions

- Already some experience with "programmes"
- Lower transaction costs could further encourage some less common project types
 Further clarifications needed:
- Definition of "project activities under a programme of activities..."
 - Who, what, where, when, why
 - Is a programme that implements a policy/standard eligible?
 - Overlap (or not) with bundles
 - Specific provision for PCDM in some areas?
